President's Report

The Club has enjoyed another very successful year across all areas of our operations and activities. Plans for the re-development of the club has moved forward, record profits from the Café and other commercial operations and winning 4 of the 7 State Championships on offer including the most coveted 'Senior State Championship'. This has been the result of years of planning and preparation by many members of the Club. With an increasing membership it has been very satisfying to also see an increase in the number of members actually getting involved in Club activities and sharing the load.

Member Services

Thanks to Sarah Price for taking on both the Secretary and Member Service Portfolio. This is a huge work load with a wide range of responsibility from Registrations to Clothing and Uniforms.

Once again the Presentation Dinner was a great success and well attended by around 200 members. Well done to Sarah, Mel and the Café Staff for a great evening. Thanks also to Kevin Richardson for performing the MC role again.

Congratulations to Bonnie Richardson on receiving the Club Person of the Year this season. Bonnie has been involved in training, coaching, organising and preparing members in the Lifesaving Competition area as well as managing all our Competition Nominations from everyday carnivals to National Championships.

Finance

The Club's financial position improved significantly this season with great profits from the Café. The Clubs cash reserves benefited from this due to the lower than usual expenditure on Capital Assets.

Whilst the Building Fund increased by \$4,690 from member contributions, I am pleased to announce that the Board has again been able to commit \$30,000 from its Cash Reserves into the Building Fund.

Facilities

Plans for the development of the new Club Facilities has progressed under the guide of Kevin Richardson. Current plans are to progress with the new build to be on the current location with appropriate designs being drawn up.

Final Signoff of the lease for the off-site storage shed has been delayed and will hopefully be completed in the coming months with the build happening quickly after.

Thanks again to Paul Rafanelli and the Café Staff led by Kate for another profitable and successful year. The Café has managed to increase income over the year whilst keeping expenses in check. This is now running as a profitable and viable commercial operation for the Club and will need to be well managed in the coming seasons to ensure the continued income.

Lifesaving Services

Thanks again to Sarah Tinkham on keeping this area running smoothly. All the required Patrol gear has been well managed and we have been able to build a stock of equipment in excellent condition and reliable.

There were no issues or problems in this area during the season. Apart from a major rescue of a fleet of sailing boats requiring assistance during a freak change of weather, the season seemed quite un-eventful. Credit to all Patrol Captains and the Club Officers who worked with Sarah this season.

Training and Education

As usual, we were able to provide many opportunities to members in attaining their proficiencies. This is a huge workload on our Trainers and Assessors. This is something we will need to be better at in coming seasons. Thanks to Graeme Cunningham and is team in managing to provide all these opportunities. The Clubs work with CALD (Culturally and Linguistically Diverse) Communities continued this season. There is a detailed report from Peter Taylor in this Report.

Graeme has also been instrumental in the implementation and running of the Duke of Edinburgh Awards within the Club. This has been very successful and well received by the Clubs Youth membership.

Surf Sports

Congratulations to Christine Newberry and her team on getting the Club into the position of the Premier Club in SA in Surf Sport. Winning 4 of the 7 Championships. What more can be said. This was a huge achievement for the Club and a result of all the competition areas getting involved and performing to their best abilities. This is an achievement that the whole club can be proud of and should all feel that they have contributed in some way.

Youth Development

The Westies Crew continues to be active and grow. This is a great little social group of our youth members aged 14 to 18 and is an important aspect of the club to ensure the engagement of our youth. Thanks to Brenda Thornton for overseeing this.

The Junior (Nipper) program was well run and actively supported again this season. Whilst numbers were down a little, I believe participation rates were still good. It was not a great summer for the beach which would affect our more social nippers attending, however the core squad was still very strong. This was highlighted again by a good showing at Junior State Championships where we once again improved our position from 4^{th} up to 3^{rd} .

A great effort across all cross all Youth Development this year and a big thanks and congratulations to Mel Davis-Bishop on managing this portfolio.

Special Events

The Nipperthon, Pink Swim and Trailblazer by the Sea were our major Special Events this season. Well done to Owen McLeod in overseeing this area.

The Nipperthon continues to grow in numbers and popularity. This is a critical event in the Surf Sports calendar for our Nippers and gives them a different type of event to enjoy. It is more suited to the endurance athlete and gives all participants an opportunity to really challenge themselves rather than just racing the person next to you.

The Pink Swim also grew in numbers and popularity. The concept is unique, the cause is inspirational and the swim is just a great social event. The money raised goes to Breast Cancer Research and patient support. Its profile was raised further by a supporting speech made in Federal Parliament by our Patron and local member Matt Williams. Whilst it is not a mainstream Surf Lifesaving Event and we are a charity organisation ourselves, this is yet another example of how the West Beach Surf Lifesaving Club is part of the fabric of the community and just one of the many ways in which we can continue to fulfil our mission of saving lifes.

The Trailblazer by the Sea was a new event this season. This was run in conjunction with SLS SA and Adelaide Rotary. It is a great ultra-running event and encourages members of the public to get out there and be active. We look forward to also growing this event in the coming years.



Finance

A great year on and off the beach, with control on spending and strong sales activity the "Clubs" financial position continues to grow.

Our building fund currently sits at \$68,110.00 this number is made up of a carryover amount from 2014 of \$33,420; the increased 2015 number is made up of \$4,690 being contributed by members with the remaining \$30,000 coming out of general revenue.

The "Cafe" had a very strong year generating a profit of \$108,107.99, an increase of \$42,265.07 over 2014 result. A fantastic number in what some would say is a very depressed market. The result sits very squarely with our Cafe manager Kate and her team, her leadership has been fantastic both in the kitchen and front of house. Credit must also be given to Paul Rafanelli for the


time he has spent with Kate and the Cafe duty managers mentoring them in the art of leadership.


Asset expenditure was very well controlled by all our directors this year with \$14,533.09 being spent.

The above and numerous other items resulted in the "Surf Club" as a whole generating a total cash position of \$97,671.15 above our 2014 result.

Tin Shedders

It's been a couple of years since we submitted a report but I thought it time to provide the club with some information that we think is relevant and worth consideration at an appropriate time. For some years now we in the Tin Shedders group have been discussing what sort of process could be developed to set up a membership base specifically for past members ie "has beens", "old scholars","still wanna be but can't" etc. There must be many past members out there who could form a new membership base which would add to membership numbers, provide criteria for clubrooms footprint and probably provide another level of club support. The Tin Shedders provide an historical level to the club, and we believe that there are levels of our club history that should be remembered, but the Tin Shedders can't go on forever. We are going to that patrolled beach in the sky at the rate of about three per year, we need to start thinking about how we might keep our history alive and at the same time add some benefit to our club.

Role of the Task Force

To develop a new West beach Surf Lifesaving Club facility by 2019. The club to be designed to meet all future needs.

Off-site Storage

Approval has been given by Adelaide Shores and Adelaide Airport Ltd to build a 265 m2 storage shed to the south of the new soccer pitch on West Beach Road.

The design, scope and documentation has been finalised.

Following finalisation of the lease agreement in late May, work will be able to start. David Afford has offered to undertake the project management of the development of this facility.

The Club Facility

Detailed concept drawings, scope and costing have been developed for the facility.

Several meetings have been held with Facilities Management group of Surf Lifesaving SA. They have committed funds for the 2016 and 2017 financial period.

Whilst the committee is seeking approval with the City of Charles Sturt for the current location, there are still several views that the club should be located to the north of our current location.

Discussions are about to begin formally with the City of Charles Sturt re locations and funding.

The current major impediment is the restoration of the rock wall. This work will cost approximately \$1.3 million.

The Council and the State Government are at odds as to who will pay for this and what each of their proportions will be. This has delayed planning as we are aware that no building can occur without a solid and effective seawall.

A presentation was made to West Beach Club members in April. The general consensus was that the direction and concept met the broader groups' needs and that we should proceed in our current direction.



From our juniors through to each sports area within the club – beach, boats, board, IRB, lifesaving events, pool rescue, ski and swim, our athletes compete in a variety of different carnivals and competitions throughout the year. In 2015... we won the senior state competition for the first time since 1965 when our name first appeared in the archived records.

Surf Life Saving is all about saving lives and patrolling our beaches in a voluntary capacity. Our competition group comes from our patrolling members. Patrolling members are the heart and soul of this club, and from this group of active members, we choose to advance our skills within surf sports and hope to better themselves as life savers and competitors.

Our results in this 2014/2015 have not been the outcome of a single years effort – it's been many years in the making, particularly the last 8 years and it reflects the hard work of our current leadership, our previous board members and our Head Coach, who had laid the foundations for a positive culture, an inclusive club and a club that has seen our juniors transition into seniors as people who want to contribute to the community and people who want to compete for the club.

Head Coach

Area Captains and Coaches

We have continued in 2014/2015 with the appointment of area captains who assist with the management of each area by effectively running activities, operating with club procedures and ensuring these procedures are adhered to,

providing accurate information to members, utilising our resources to hold information sessions conducted by invited experts in fields that will providing tools/education and information to further encourage our members and athletes to enhance their learning.

At the beginning of the season, we set goals and objectives for West Beach during the competition season. An athlete's handbook was produced containing all information for the athletes for the season. We will rely more heavily on the handbook for providing information into the future. We assessed our team selection policy, our club equipment allocation policy, introducing a yearly plan for training and competition which will continue to assist in evolving the growth and development of athletes within the club. We encouraged the development of our coaches with additional training and workshops that will enable them to constantly evaluate, plan, assessing strategies and objectives to ensure the future success of surf sports participation at West Beach, whilst remaining excellent role models for our members.

Surf Sports will continue to navigate and evolve to assist in the development of members' skills and fitness. For members who are more competitive we are defining a structure which will assist with training, coaching and competition and define a pathway for higher athlete development, whilst continuing to encourage participation in club activities which are fun and inclusive, even as our community at West Beach continues to grow and expand.

Gear and Equipment

This Season has seen a significant reduction in the amount of finances expended on gear and equipment, primarily as many members have invested in private equipment. This has seen an improvement in the quality of equipment available for competition. Much of our equipment is ageing and with limited storage space it is difficult to constantly recycle gear. We hope to fundraise for a new surfboat as this area is a growth area for our youth and following our Gold medal in the inaugural Under 19 event, we hope to see the numbers of members rowing, continuing to increase.

Training

Our winter training commenced in May 2014, with Board training sessions at West Lakes at the West Lakes Rowing club, ski sessions on the Patawalonga and the boats also out on the lake. During the winter months, the club's swimming training held at Immanuel Pool on Tuesday and Thursday's - 7 -8pm provided an excellent alternative cross training session. Swimming continued to be popular all season and is an area that will continue to grow. We have been providing open water swim sessions early morning, and these are also seeing growth in numbers.

As the weather warmed up the juniors joined in and come day light saving time, we moved training to the beach. Numbers were consistently good and the number of sessions increased as we got closer to the competition season commencing. For our final board session alone before states we had over 55 people in the water!

We have aimed to provide a range of training for all members, whether they are beginners or new bronzies, or surf hardy and experienced and we will continue to develop the opportunities we provide for training.

State and Development Team

Our congratulations go to our athletes selected to represent West Beach SLSC and South Australia in the Development and State teams. This year our devolvement team athletes were able to travel to Victoria from the 8th – 11th January 2015 to contest the Southern States Challenge and the State Team athletes travelled to Sydney to compete in the Interstate Championships on 23rd January 2015.

Benjamin Zuill was selected as the team captain which is a significant honour.

Ski Report

If I was asked to select the highlight of the surf ski area this season I certainly would struggle to pick out one, there are just so many to choose from. I could go on for hours on end about all the great results the club has achieved in this area and comparing this season to seasons 3-5 years ago overwhelms me on how far everyone has come. The most successful age group, and the most competitive, in the ski area was our opens (both male and female). This doesn't only include our open competitors; it includes our younger paddlers stepping up to open level to contribute in team events.

For example, the gold and silver medals in the female open ski relay both went to West Beach SLSC with team A and team B taking out 1st and 2nd respectively. Team A consisted of Cat McArthur, Holly Batty & Kate Curtis while team B was made up of Brittany Jessup, Elena Davis & Jess Ireland. Team A's male counterparts Owen McLeod, Glenn Rypp and Chris Kither put on a cracking show to also claim gold in the men's Open ski relay – the first since 2010 states. Team

B also placed top 6 in open men's with Jayden Ellis, Matt Sharp and Ben Zuill.

Sticking with the ski relay theme, the U19 boys led by Chris Kither, Jayden Ellis and Matt Zuill managed silver against a strong Brighton outfit.

Moving onto the fastest craft on the water, the double skis produced valuable points for the club. The Open male team A (Glenn Rypp & Owen McLeod) gained bronze, the Open female team A (Cat McArthur & Brittany Jessup) claimed gold while team B (Holly Batty & Kate Curtis) got top 6. Our mixed double ski teams A (Glenn Rypp, Cat McArthur) B (Owen McLeod, Elena Davis) placed 1st and 5th respectively. The controversial race in the U19 men's double luckily gave us gold (Chris Kither & Jayden Ellis) and silver (Ryland Newberry & Matt Zuill)

Undoubtedly a strength in West Beach's competition area, the ski paddling ability of Jayden Ellis, Chris Kither, Kate Curtis and Brittany Jessup saw them being selected in the South Australian State Team that competed at Newport in January. Their selections were justified when Chris paddled his way past renowned paddler Riley Fitzsimons (NSW) in the mixed ski relay and Jayden Ellis claimed 4th in the youth ski race. Jayden also backed up his selection on many occasions with his first gold in an individual ski race (U19 men's single ski race) and a finals berth in the national U19 men's ski race. A welldeserved effort from the ever hardworking man. Brittany Jessup backed her selection at States earning a well-deserved silver in the U19 singles!

It's hard to talk about individuals but a special mention is owed to veteran ski paddler and sprint kayaker Glenn Rypp. The Open Men's single ski is arguably the toughest race to win as this has the largest amount of entrants and you are tapping into specialist paddlers and kayakers. Until March 29th 2015, no ski paddler in West Beach's 59-year history had ever won the Open men's ski race. Therefore I consider this a landmark in the club's surf sports area. Glenn was also part of the gold medal ski relay team, the Bronze medal Taplin

team, Lifesaver relay team, Gold medal Open mixed double ski with Cat McArthur, and teaming up with Owen McLeod for the bronze medal in the Open men's double ski race. A last minute decision meant Glenn went on to compete at The National titles and gained a Quarter finals berth amongst the most elite paddlers in the world in the individual ski. Credit is owed to Glenn for his small mentoring role for our younger paddlers towards the latter end of the season.

Cat McArthur was one of the best competitors at state titles winning gold in all 4 ski races: Open singles, open doubles, open ski relay, and open mixed doubles. This is a record that may not be matched for a while and it doesn't include Cat's heroics in the open Taplin and open iron woman. At the National Titles, Cat was a driving force in progressing the female open Taplin into the final and open ski relay final. The highlight would have to come when Cat made the national open women's ski final and placed 8th amongst Olympians and senior Australian representatives Naomi Flood, Jo Bridgen-Jones, Hannah Minogue & Alyce Burnett



Selecting a winner for the ski award has never been tougher for me. When I was first

asked to nominate someone I could think of at least 6 worthy contenders. After lengthy discussions and considerable thought I'd like to award Jayden Ellis as our ski-paddler of the year. An award like this is not based on pure results; it is a combination of that, their commitment to the club across the whole season and willingness to learn. Jayden made his 4th State team via his ski paddling ability and came away with some great results in Sydney. He also 'did the double' by winning gold in both the U19 single and double ski races at states and put on noteworthy performances in the open Taplin and u19 ski relay. After a successful season in both surf ski and sprint kayaking, Jayden was rewarded with a finals berth at the National U19 ski race.

I realize this report drags on for a while but there are so many more results that I have missed out, as there's just too many to choose from. A huge thanks is due to Steve Perry and Peter Zuill for coaching the ski squad, the support from the board of directors, and a shout-out to David Earl for transporting the skis to Nationals and Interstates. The position the club is in right now because of its members is not a birthright, It is something we hold on loan out of respect for our past, for the youth of today, for the kids and leaders of tomorrow.



Special Events

2014/15 has seen two major events run by the club, the Nipperthon and the West Beach Pink Swim. It feels like yesterday when preparations began on planning for these. A lot of members of the club have contributed in some way to make these events possible. Whether your involvement was large or small, we appreciate you giving up your time as the success shared in this area wouldn't have been possible.

The first major event held by the club was the Nipperthon 2015. We had 143 nippers from across the state compete on Sunday 25th January in an endurance based iron person race. A large part of the nippers were made up of the U9-U12 age groups so it was pleasing to see a lot of talent and participation from the kids. There were some great prizes on offer, with the major prize being a Walbridge Nipper board donated by the West Beach Bendigo Bank Branch. Overall, nearly \$1,500 was raised for the West Beach SLSC as well as a great opportunity for our young surf lifesavers to test themselves against the state's best and in a different format to conventional carnivals. A big thanks must go to the Nipperthon event organizer Brenda Thornton and her committee along with Mel Davis-Bishop, Sarah Tinkham & Paul Raffanelli and all the parents who supported the event through registrations, work party, BBQ, sponsorship, presentations, taking photos, and in many other ways.

Three weekends later, the highly anticipated community fundraiser the Pink Swim 2015 was held on Valentine's Day the 14th February. This event supports the National Breast Cancer Foundation (NBCF) and Breast Cancer Network (BCNA) of Australia. This was the third occasion this event has been held by the club and are delighted that we have now raised over \$25,000 for these community organisations.

This event, has a significant positive profile for the West Beach SLSC as we are on show to the wider, non-surf community. The event is non competitive and resulted in many members of the community participating without any pressure of winning and losing. The club gains significant publicity and we saw additional members join as well the added bonus of a huge as boost in café and clothing sales. We won the City of Charles Sturt Event of the Year in 2014 for this event which adds to positive marketing for the club.

In addition to the swim distances a 200m, 400m, 700m and 1000m swim, this year we added a 'Pink Walk'. This event is unique in that 100% of the entry fee for the swim (or walk) is donated to the NBCF and the BCNA and it is now Australia's largest noon-competitive ocean water swim. By participating in Pink Swim 2015 we contributed over \$12,000 to the NBCF who focus on research to aid the prevention of breast cancer. This is a wonderful achievement and we were delighted to reach 600 participants up from 380 in 2014.

Thank you to all our members, external volunteers, bar staff and team leaders who helped out to contribute to the success of this event. Our sponsors were Finz, Dare 2 Tri, Woolworths, Clubs SA, Adelaide Shores, Charles Sturt Council, the Cancer Council SA, Fulham Fresh, The Albion Hotel Abbotts Printing, Gatti Sports, Sprint Automart and Vitality Brands.

The event ambassadors include ex Olympic swimmer and participant Phil Rogers and in addition Steven Marshall the Opposition Leader, Matt Williams the Federal Member for Hindmarsh and Paul Caica the Member for Colton, help maintain the high profile that this event is gaining and we hope to continue this trend in 2016. The event was run without a hitch and a highlight was the minutes silence and beautiful rendition of the National Anthem sung by Jackie Yeo.

Christine Newberry and Paul Rafanelli were a great support with the Pink Swim and the organizing committee and are to be commended on their hard work, the planning which was 7 months in the making.

The Pink Swim will be held again in 2016 again on Valentine's Day, on Sunday 14th February 2016.

The inaugural Trailblazer Run was held on Sunday 3rd May 2015. This is a joint effort by Surf Lifesaving South Australia and The Rotary Club of Adelaide, with the proceeds raised being split between the two organizations. There were 150 runners participate across varying distances ranging from 8km, right through to 51km. West Beach SLSC assisted by setting up an aid-station for nutrition and first aid assistance. Thanks to

our members Sonya and Steve Salter, Nancy Cullen, Daphne McLeod and Peter and Matt Zuill for helping out on the day.

This will be held in 2016 with a push for more participants next year.
