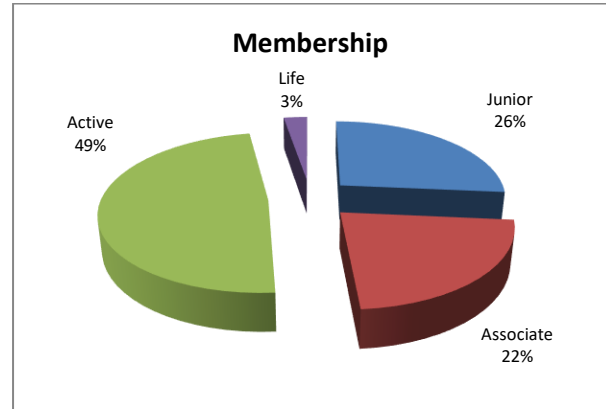
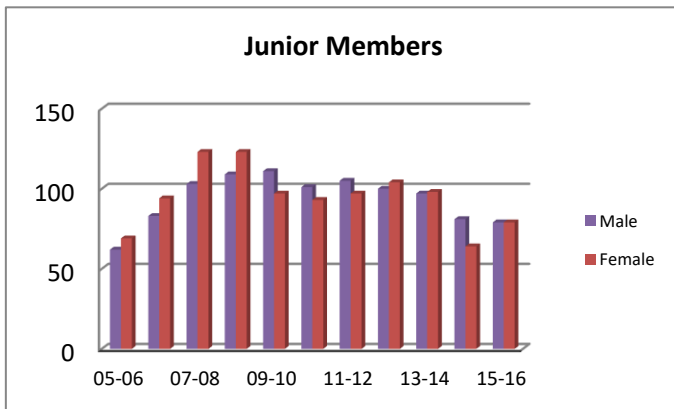
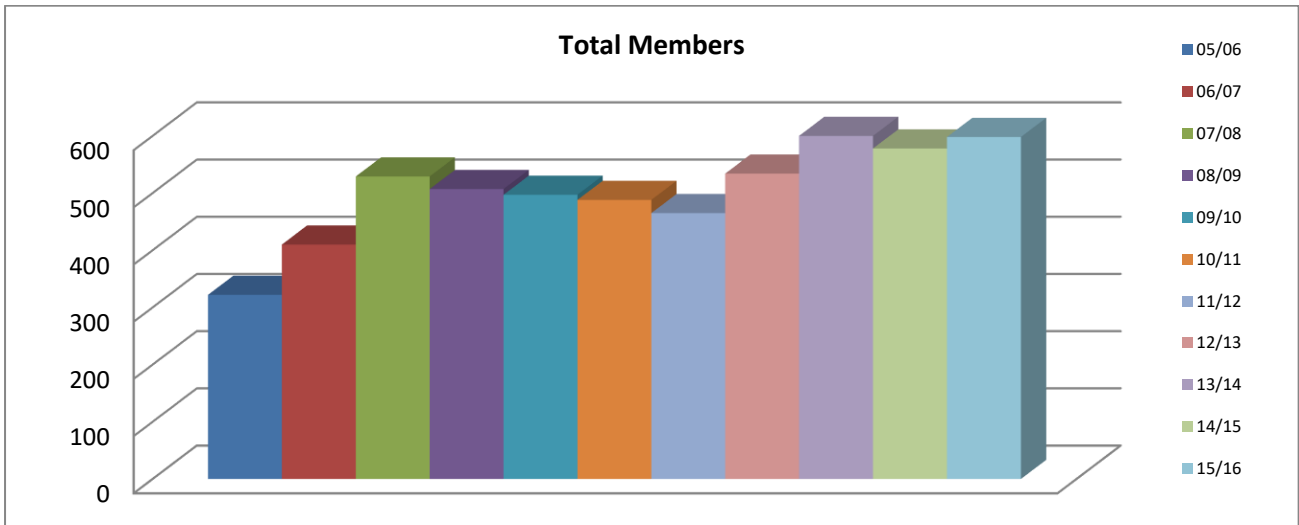

Finance

Another strong year on and off the beach, with strong sales activity the "Clubs" asset and finance position continues to grow.

Our Building Fund currently sits at \$88,740.00. This number is made up of a carry-over amount from 2015 of \$28,420, and the increased 2016 number is made up of \$5,320.00 being contributed by members with the remaining \$54,680.00 coming from general revenue.

The "Cafe" has had a very strong year generating a profit of \$133,800.00, an increase of \$25,692 over the 2015 result. Kate's financial acumen continues to grow which in turn enhancing her teams understanding of the need to look outside the square for additional profitable sales opportunities. Credit for the sales and profit growth must also be given to Norm Collins and Paul Rafanelli for the time they have spent mentoring Kate. The Café closing inventory sits at \$52,839.00 up by \$30,844.00 over last year. The reason for this is a business strategy to bulk buy to receive greater discounts. (For each 10 beer kegs ordered we received 1 free meaning extra profit of \$5,000.00, and for each 10 cartons of wine ordered we received 1 free carton meaning extra profit of \$1,800.00 = \$6800.00) Simply put, we all know fixed term interest rates are very low meaning the extra stock generates more money than money in the bank.

Asset expenditure this year was \$174,396.35 compared to \$14,533.09 last year with the larger amounts listed below.

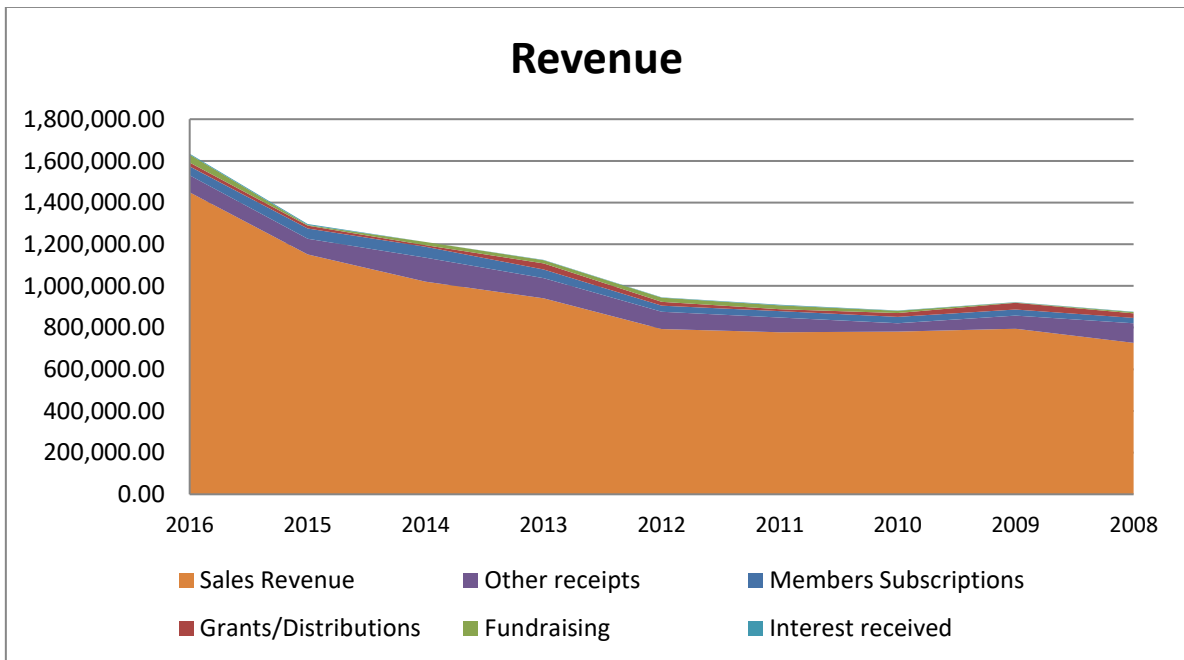
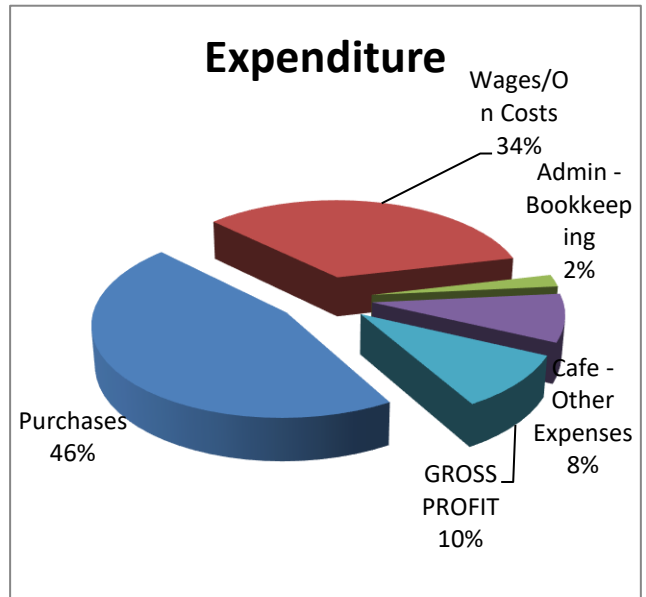
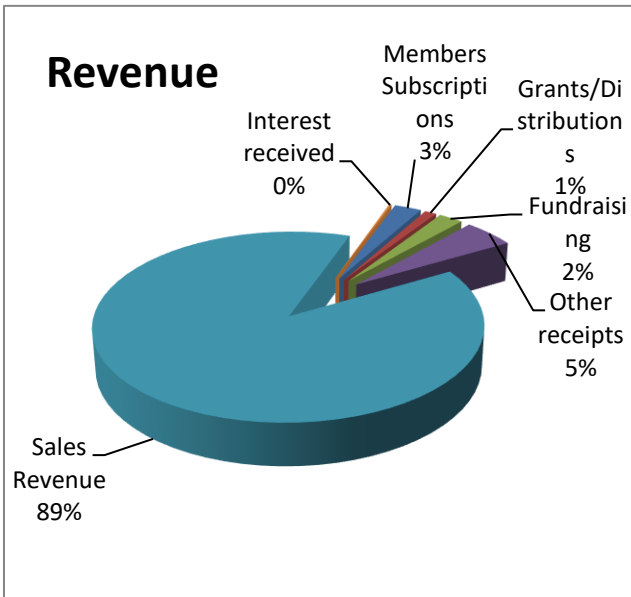

A group of us still meet for lunch once a month in the club cafe and we thank Kate, Jess, Jo' and all the staff for their great service and culinary delights. Our congratulations go to all club members for your achievements during the 2015/2016 season. Club Redevelopment

Over the past 12 months' considerable work has been undertaken by the Redevelopment Committee, comprising Kevin Richardson (Chair), Stephen Perry, Paul Rafanelli and Dave Afford, along with the assistance and input of Peter Zuill.

To date we have:

- Undertaken a Site Analysis of possible locations between the Adelaide Sailing Club and the Henley Sailing Club.
- Site has been surveyed to assess levels.
- Conducted an analysis of other club plans both in SA and other states.
- Several concept designs have been developed for the new facility.
- Developed a facilities plan schedule .
- Met several occasions with Coastal Protection staff, Architects, SLSSA and coastal engineers.
- Decanting and storage facility approved and almost completed.
- Developed a preliminary financial plan.

Recently in, collaboration with SLSSA we have meet with the City of Charles Sturt staff to develop a way forward for our redevelopment.

The most significant challenge is the poor state of the rock wall adjacent the club. Currently the state of the wall would not enable the construction of a new building at our current site. The club commissioned its own independent

coastal engineer to assist us and he confirmed that the wall will need a total rebuild, a new design and an additional concrete wall in front of the club to prevent wave overtopping.

This was consistent with the report that was commissioned by the City of Charles Sturt.

The cost of rebuilding the wall alone is approximately \$1.4 million.

We are still moving forward with our preferred site, which is our current location, and in addition we are assessing options closer to the original tin shed site, north of the club.

The decanting and storage shed, near the Lady Reds Soccer pitch, has almost been completed. Thanks to the work of Dave Afford and several club members, with the assistance of our sponsors. We are indebted to the amazing support of Adelaide Shores for providing a superb site.

The committee is continuing to work with SLSSA and the local Council, and we anticipate having a clear direction on funding and strategy before the start of the 2016/17 season.

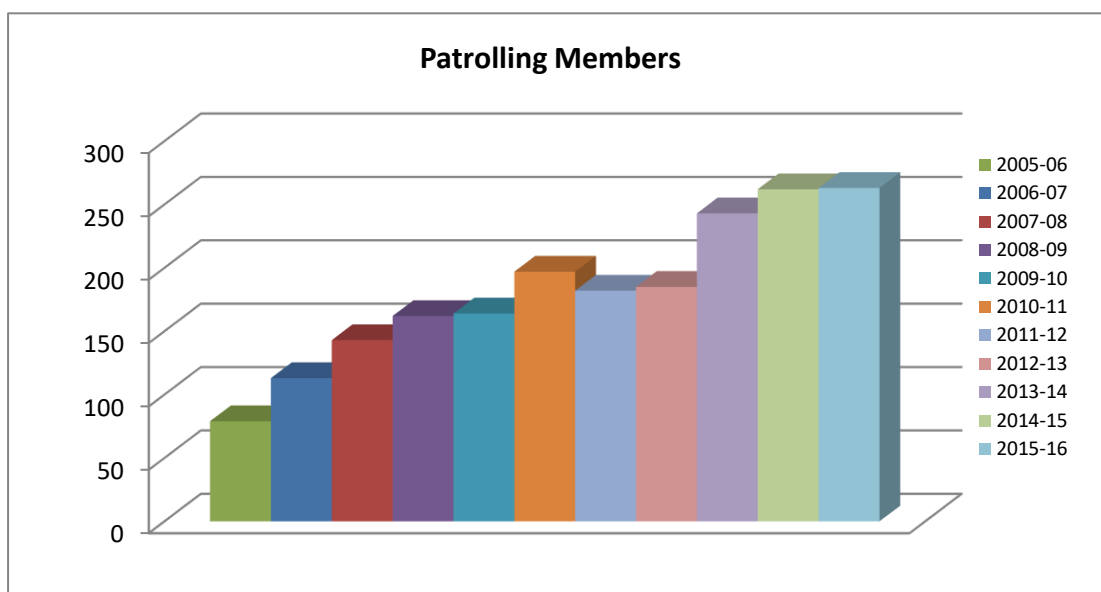

We have 4 members that have completed the Silver award level this season; they are Ellen

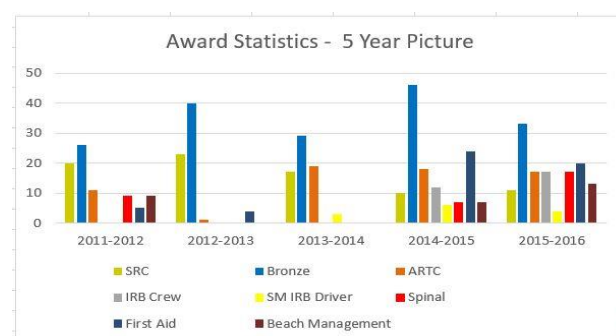

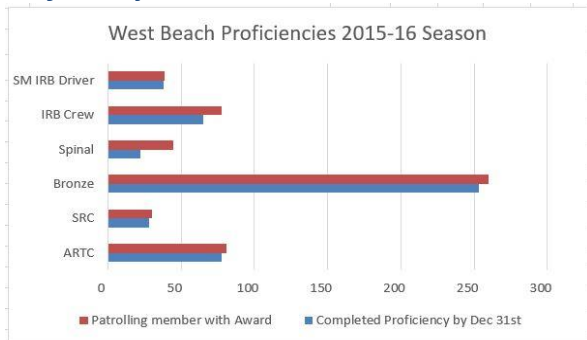
Award statistics 2015-16

This year we held Beach management, Advance resuscitation and spinal management courses prior to the October start of the season when the upstairs training room is more available and concentrated on the water based awards during the summer months. This worked well but the availability of a training room during the summer limits class room trainings to Monday nights or requiring the instructor to relocate boats and or gym equipment. We had 8 members attend the train the trainers training course at the start of the season with these members progressing to achieve the trainer award over the next 2 seasons.



There was a reduction from 46 to 32 in new bronze members this season as we had less junior parents obtaining the bronze award. The breakdown of bronze award show approx 1/3 new members, 1/3 members parents and the remainder are SRC members continuing to the bronze award.

Proficiency 2015-16 Season



This year ARTC and Spinal proficiencies were run in August and September prior to the season starting reducing the demand on assessors during the summer months and utilizing the availability of the function room as a training facility. Bronze proficiencies were held on the second patrol rotation this season when the water is slightly warmer with 253 member completing their proficient by December 31st.

Patrol Skills Breakdown



More patrolling members improved their skills and obtained advanced awards with the spinal management, IRB crew and drivers, Beach management, first aid and ARTC run this season. We are continuing with the aim of improving the skill level of our patrols with 50% of patrolling members now holding 2 or more awards and 15% of patrolling members having 4+ awards.

Community Programs

Charles Sturt School Holidays Sports Program



These sessions were held during the October and April school holidays and were greatly successful with over 37 youth attending each day learning water safety and lifesaving skills.

Red Shed Community Lifesaving session



This session was held during the April school holidays and was greatly successful with over 35 youth from the Eastern Suburbs attending the day.

West Torrens Council beach day



The club combined with West Torrens council to run a beach day as part of their school holiday program. The day was a great success with about 120 people on the beach and 20 lifesavers for water cover.

The IRB rides were the hit of the day and the Council is very happy with the way we ran it and will be back next year.

The 2015/16 season has been very successful for West Beach S.L.S.C. with 2 refugees gaining Bronze medallion and IRB crew awards.



We also had 9 participants gained the advanced resuscitation Certificate and 2 achieved Resuscitation with AED.

West Beach was awarded The Office of Volunteer's Community Program award in June 2015 after being nominated by Surf Life Saving SA. The presentation was held at the Festival Theatre and presided by the governor of SA, Hieu Van Le and the minister for Multicultural affairs Hon Zoe Bettison MP.



October saw the start of the first CALD Bronze group with 2 members from Iran, 1 from England, 1 Scotsman and 2 Australians gaining the Bronze just before Christmas.



A Community Celebration Dinner was held on January 23. It was an Interactive Multicultural event to celebrate the shared experiences of Australian culture. It was a very successful night with 90 people attending and many special guests, Kelly Vincent (SA Dignity for Disability MLC), Mohammad Al-Khafaji (CEO of Welcome Australia), Uncle Victor (Aboriginal Elder), Peter Zuill and Graeme Cunningham (West Beach S.L.S.C.), Steve Cornish and Lee Patterson (S.L.S.S.A.) and Jemma Taylor (Manager of Y.W.C.A.South Australia). From this event there were many enquiries from new arrivals about learning surf lifesaving. As a result we have 9 new members that achieved their ARTC, plus 2 junior members that have gained their CPR with AED.

These members are working towards achieving the bronze award next season and have started swimming lessons to improve their water skills.



West Beach held an information afternoon at Thebarton Senior College in November and a Come and Try day in January. The event was a great success with participants learning many things about beach safety. One participant had never been in the ocean before and was very happy at the end of the day after learning to catch waves on a board.



A further information day was held on the 8th April with the aim of getting students to do the

ARTC over the winter months. The response for this course has been very good with 17 new registrations. The course will start in term 2 on Monday afternoons.

March sees the beginning of two new partnerships for West Beach working with “Welcome Australia” and the “Migrant Resource Centre South Australia”. Programs and planning will be established over the winter months.

Success breeds success and it is wonderful to see that people want to come to West Beach to be a part of the team that we are.

The championship point structure implemented by SLSSA – where top six placings at carnivals leading up to States, account for 25% of a club's State Titles overall score – means that the carnivals and carnival attendance all count towards the final states results. All senior carnivals this season were held at Southport SLSC, hoping to provide our competitors with a chance of a wave, but surf as a sport can't command ideal conditions and we are always crossing our fingers for some swell on the day. The most significant change to senior carnivals this season was the inclusion of Under 14's to combine with the Under 15's to form a Youth Area. This mirrors the introduction of the Youth Championships at Aussies in 2015 and we were able to represent our concerns with some discussion regarding the proposed change facilitated by SLSSA. The Youth were given their own area at carnivals which provided them with a transition area from juniors to seniors whilst enabling them to experience the atmosphere of a senior carnival. Overall, I believe the change was successful and will improve with additional resources that SLSSA will no doubt bring. Our Under 14's and U15's are the future of our club and they should be commended for their fantastic results. A special mention to Gretel Mead and Harrison Dawkins who contributed

won 23 and 21 points individually and as a team, our under 14/15s earned 53 additional points.

So did we feel the pressure of backing up from last year's win? No! I could say we dropped their reel in fact. Well, we did in the Under 17 march past, however, they picked it up, kept marching and (almost got away with it) but sadly went from Gold to 6th in the blink of an eye. This pretty well sums up the season. It highlighted our courage and determination, it highlighted our shared responsibility with a sense of inclusion and a never say die attitude. It is highlighted how:

- Every competitor who competed in events they didn't feel comfortable in...
- those who ran when they don't normally run,
- those who swam when they don't normally swim,
- those who marched when they don't normally march,
- those who tackled new events,
- To all those who competed and felt disappointed with their results,
- To those who competed and achieved the ultimate success,
- To those who competed and had fun,
- To those who competed, officiated, team managed, drove trailers, packed tents, bought uniforms, drove to training, came on time, came late, swept the sheds, played with purpose, aimed high – took risks, trained to win, showed humility, respect and excellence, remembered that no one is bigger than the team and

The team... always came first ... we really achieved the unexpected and backed up our win from last years, to win Senior States by 11 points. An incredible achievement.

Senior States wasn't our only win. Our Masters also backed up from last year and won again. This was another amazing team effort with our Master's boaties sealing the win.

We have continued in 2015/2016 with the appointment of area captains who assist with the management of each area by effectively running activities, operating with club procedures and ensuring these procedures are adhered to, providing accurate information to members, utilising our resources to hold information sessions conducted by invited experts in fields that will providing tools/education and information to further encourage our members and athletes to enhance their learning.

At the beginning of the season, we set goals and objectives for West Beach during the competition season. We assessed our team selection policy, our club equipment allocation policy, introducing a yearly plan for training and competition which will continue to assist in evolving the growth and

development of athletes within the club. We encouraged the development of our coaches with additional training and workshops that will enable them to constantly evaluate, plan, assessing strategies and objectives to ensure the future success of surf sports participation at West Beach, whilst remaining excellent role models for our members.

Athlete Reward Program

The West Beach Athlete Reward Program (ARP) at West Beach SLSC (WBSLSC) is an incentive based program available to ALL senior competitors and offers rewards to competitors who fulfil the requirements of the program.

In providing the competition and coaching facilities to members, we incur costs both financially and socially within the club. The ARP is designed to allow members access to competition, coaching facilities and access to club and competition equipment with minimal cost to themselves.

The club needs assistance and good conduct from its members in order to provide these facilities and the ARP shows members what is expected from them in return for the provision of coaching and access to competition.

It also rewards those who excel at their competition whilst maintaining the level of assistance and conduct expected as a member of WBSLSC.

Gear and Equipment

This season we introduced a Craft Purchase Policy which assists individual members to purchase their own gear and equipment. We were fortunate to have purchased a first double ski this season, the first new ski in the club in many years and with 6 double ski teams in open men's, we really do need them!

Much of our equipment continues to age and whilst we weren't able to receive a new boat this season, it has been ordered and will arrive at the club prior to the next season starting. We are in need of equipment with the constant use our

club equipment gets with training and competition. Maintaining ageing equipment is expensive and with more members purchasing their own gear, this has assisted the club with rotating our current equipment assets. In addition, the new shed is a valuable asset that will be vital to assist with protecting our equipment both new and old.

Training

Our winter training commenced in May 2015, with Board training sessions at the West Lakes Rowing club, ski sessions and boats out on the Patawalonga Lake. During the winter months, the club's swimming training continued at Immanuel Pool on Tuesday and Thursday's and provided an excellent alternative cross training session. Swimming continued to be popular all season and is an area that will continue to grow. We have been providing open water swim sessions early morning, and these are also seeing growth in numbers.

We have aimed to provide a range of training for all members, whether they are beginners or new Bronzies, or surf hardy and experienced and we will continue to develop the opportunities we provide for training.

State and Development Team

Our congratulations go to our athletes selected to represent West Beach SLSC and South Australia in the development and state teams. This year our development team athletes were able to travel to Torquay, Victoria from the 6th – 11th January 2016 to contest the Southern States Challenge and the State Team athletes competed in the Interstate Championships.

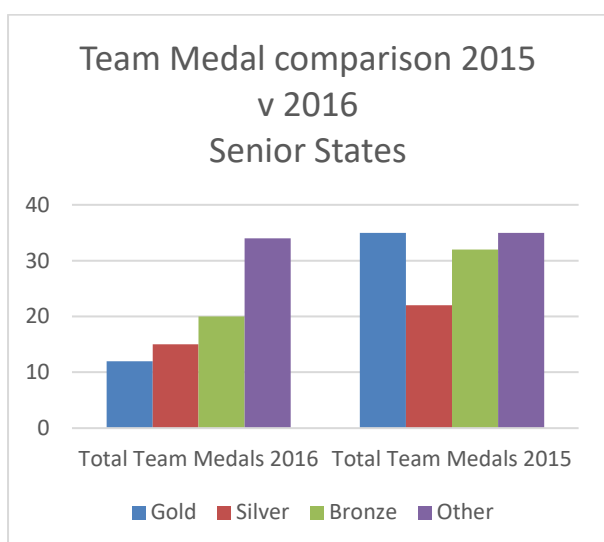
Photographer

We managed to claim 8 team placings and 5 more teams in the top 6 over the 8 gender and age categories, including a 2nd and 3rd double, in both the open women and under 19 women events which is pretty hard to do, requiring 6 of the best board paddlers in the state.

Although the lifesaver relay and the Taplin are multi-discipline it was still amazing for the club to take out the 3 biggest team events on the schedule - the open male Taplin, open female Taplin and the open lifesaver relay. This is the first time we had won the open male Taplin or the lifesaver relay, let alone both in one year.

Along with the great relays there were also some outstanding individual results, a couple notable mentions are Nathan Hettner, the Jag King, coming from the clouds to catch the lead wave and have perfect the finish to come away with the win.

Unlike Nathan, our U15 guru girl Gretel did it the hard way and managed to lead practically from start to finish to take out the U15 female board race.

Unfortunately in surf you don't always get the luck and we saw a bit of this, James Borlase couldn't catch a break when it happened in both the U14 board and iron but still came away with a 4th and a 3rd respectively, just being edged out on the day by Harry Dawkins who got 3rd and 2nd, as first years on the mals i hope you guys enjoyed it and are keen for a hard cold winter.

On the topic of jags our board award winner this year, Sophie Zuill, got a bit unlucky. As a first year 17, and a young one at that, it was the first time she was allowed to compete in the open category. It was close to a fairy-tale finish, but it just wasn't meant to be, she lead the whole way, put at least a board length on the field but was mowed down by a wave but still ended up with a second, THEN went in to the U17 board race where she was winning by even more and unfortunately had almost exactly the same fate, this one really got to her. Honestly it shows how much it meant to her.



I genuinely believe everyone in the training group can learn something from the way Sophie trains, including the opens. You won't meet anyone who "just gets on with it" without complaining as well as Sophie does, and when she is told to "pick it up" she always has another level. With young competitors like herself, West Beach has a bright future in the board area.

They are so important yet I'm surprised they haven't always received the recognition they deserve, so thanks to you all. To represent our club we can't expect parents and competitors to pay for all their training fees plus travel and transport and nominations. As representatives of this club there should be and is funding available through the ARP (Athlete Reward Program). It is under this umbrella that all competition (boats, board and ski, pool lifesaving, IRB, etc) sits to ensure funding is ongoing and the support of the club is not taken for granted.

Lastly, 1%ers: you may be turning up to all sessions under the sun but eating poorly, staying up late, not resting, not warming down, not stretching, not checking your gear, forgetting competition nutrition and hydration, turning up before time and leaving after sessions are over, leaving any of this up to someone else, etc.

You are probably never going to be 100% fit when training or racing but don't bring it to competition or training. Suck it up and get on with it as your peer next to you is probably going through something similar and doesn't need reminding.

The NBCF came from Sydney this year to celebrate the day with us and informed us that we are their second highest fundraising event in SA and despite the conditions, we raised and donated \$10,896.01. This brings the total we have raised to \$35198.37 in the 4 years we have held the event.

The event has been held as a celebration and support to those people who have been affected or touched by breast cancer. The swim and walk distances to represent the journey that cancer sufferers and survivors undertake as they tackle cancer and their treatment. The event gives the club, its members and the community the chance to take part in the largest non-competitive swim in Australia, to help raise money for breast cancer research. We look forward to our 5th event in 2017.
