#### Member Services

This year we ran without a Director in this portfolio and so thanks must go to Brenda Thornton, Christine Newberry and Mel Davis-Bishop who covered this portfolio as well as their own. Thanks also to Leca Reading who took on the Registrars role and other tasks usually in this portfolio.

After the great event for the Clubs 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary last year, this year's Senior Presentation Night was not as grand, however it was still a very successful and fun night. Thanks again to Kevin Richardson for MC and keeping the evening on track. It was a pleasure to have MP Steve Georganas and State candidates Matt Cowdrey and Steven Rypp as our guests.

Anthony Thomas was recognised this year for his efforts over the season when he was named Club Person of the Year. Anthony's efforts throughout the year across Junior's, Patrols and managing our many events we host are much appreciated.

#### Finance

I thought we had pretty much hit the limits of what we could turn over through the Café. How wrong was I. Our Capital expenditure is still high and as we move closer to the re-development, this is something we will have to continue to get tighter on. Thanks to Dave Afford for his efforts once again in this portfolio and look forward to where we can go from here.

#### Facilities

This portfolio was taken on by Norm Collins this season. Norm has a great deal of experience in the hospitality business and was able to build on the great framework left by Paul Rafanelli to take this to the next level.

Thanks again to Norm and the Café Staff led by Kate. They continued to provide a very profitable income stream for the club to allow us to operate.

#### Lifesaving Services

As part of the National 'Beyond the Flags' strategy, this season we trialled extended patrolling hours during January. This trial gave better coverage of our services and provided greater visibility of our service. A surveillance patrol was setup between 9am and 12pm on each of our normal patrol days in that period. There was generally good feedback on this and I believe, as a club we should be looking at more opportunities like this.

I must congratulate Sarah Tinkham on the great job she did again this season. The task of organising the resources required to cover our Patrol obligations as well as the myriad of Special Events we run is a huge task.

#### Training and Education

Graeme Cunningham continues to push the limits of this portfolio and identified and created awareness of the benefits to Yr 12 Students in obtaining qualifications through Lifesaving that adds to their ATAR. A great initiative and promotion for the Club. Thanks again to Graeme and his team for getting through all the required Proficiencies and Awards. This task gets bigger each season as our Patrolling Numbers continue to grow and the level of qualification of our members continues to increase with more members completing additional awards.

#### Surf Sports

Once again, Christine Newberry and the Surf Sports area have performed exceptionally well. Winning 3 in a row Senior State Championships is unbelievable. Unfortunately conditions at the National Championships resulted in the cancellation of many of the events and so we will have to wait another year to see how we are progressing at that level.

The next 12 to 18 months will be particularly challenging for this are as we head into the ILS World Championships being held in Adelaide (Glenelg Beach) in November 2018. This is a great opportunity for all our competitive members and we need to start planning and preparing for this.

#### Youth Development

Numbers of Juniors remains steady, however what this doesn't show is the number of kids we have been able to keep as we progress and transition them into Seniors. The retention of members across the change from Juniors to Seniors is always difficult, however we have seen an increasing number of members now making that transition.

This is a credit to the Junior Program being run by Mel Davis Bishop and her Junior Committee and band of Age Managers and Helpers. By providing the right balance of activities, opportunities and pathways, we should be able to keep members engaged and interested as we progress them across the transition.







## **Membership Statistics**






Note: Reporting of U14 membership has moved from 'Juniors' into 'Active' from 2015



## Finance


Another strong financial year, with strong sales activity the "Clubs" asset and finance position continues to grow with our revenue reaching a record \$1,920,328.49.



Our building fund currently sits at \$95,140.00. This number is made up of a carry-over amount from 2016 of \$88,740, the increased 2016 number is made up of \$6,400.00 being contributed by members.

The "Cafe" has had a very strong year with turnover of \$1,702,647.49 generating an operating profit of \$230,590.05, an increase of \$100,290.73 over the 2016 result. Credit for the sales and profit growth must be given to both Kate and Norm for their diligence in not only looking at ways to grow revenue but also overall expense control. The Café closing inventory sits at \$38,726.00 down by \$14,113.00 over last year.



The above and numerous other items resulted in the "Surf Club" as a whole generating a total cash position at year-end of \$254,817.99 an increase \$50,929.39 on the previous year.





## **Tin Shedders**

This year I thought it would be appropriate to let you all know the basis of the Tin Shed Group and how it was originally formed.

One of our most loved and respected members during the 50's through to the 70's was Dennis "Bull" Galpin. A big man with a big heart, champion boatie and a member of the senior 'A' crew for years. Tragically in July 1981 Dennis died of a massive heart attack at the age of 42 years and it was at his funeral that the title "Tin Shedder" was introduced by Barry Maloney. The concept, for those who had membership between 1955 and 1963 (when the current clubhouse was built) didn't move forward until early 2004 when Maloney suggested we have a Tin Shed reunion celebration in November 2005 to celebrate 50 years. Ashley Bahnisch spent months tracking down names addresses and email addresses, and a working party was formed to arrange the reunion. And what a reunion it was. Over 60 Tin Shedders from all over Australia, with wives or partners attending a wonderful night of food and frivolity in the club cafe. The tradition has continued with further reunions in 2010 and 2015.

Now each year we lose a few to that great patrol beach in the sky, some change email addresses and I lose touch. I have about 60 Tin Shedders on my contacts list but it must be remembered that only about 40% of those show interest in what we do, so our active list decreases a little year by year. We are slowly losing club history. At this point I'd like to point out that our oldest living West Beach, and Tin Shed member is Fred (Freddie) Green. Fred lives in Bundaberg in QLD with his wife Audrey. Fred is a life member, was a champion boat sweep, and for those of you who didn't know, actually developed and designed the sloping seat for surf boats of ply and laminex to enable rowers to take a longer stroke with more leg drive. Fred is 87 years old and still takes a keen interest in our club.

Now let's talk about the Bunnings BBQ's. How did they eventuate?

Early in 2011 the club arranged with Bunnings at Mile End to conduct a number of BBQ's on week days for fund raising purposes. It proved to be difficult with volunteer members either at school, university or working. We heard about this and volunteered to take it on for the club, and as most of you know the rest is history. Because of our involvement, the club and us have become Bunnings Mile End favourites. We even have favourite and returning customers. Our BBQ's are normally on the second Monday of the month and we must be on site between 8.00 am and 4.00 pm.

It is important that you know how the profits are managed. We have a special club account with Bendigo Bank at West Beach (a major sponsor). All expenses are recorded and managed by me and all sales are deposited in the account. It was important to us that the profits were not deposited to general revenue and the club agreed that, although it is club money any request for financial assistance would be in the form of a club project.

We, the Tin Shedders, would then have the benefit of knowing to what we had contributed giving us a real sense of purpose. To date that contribution has been to; upgraded air conditioning, upgraded heating, solar panels, a new surf boat and the new cooler and freezer so important for the cafe. So to finish off the BBQ's story, we conducted our first in April 2011. We have just completed 6 years, conducted 67 BBQ's, cooked over 32,000 sausages and the profit is in excess of \$68,000.00. Our current bank balance is over \$12,000.00.

Now back to the important bits.

Once again the club has done remarkably well in competition.

The Juniors slipped a bit this year but with more Nippers coming through to swell the Junior ranks it won't be too long before they are back where they belong.....on top. Our Golden Oldies at the Masters came in a very close second to Seacliff, 979 points to West Beach 967.5 points. So well done team you're a credit to our club.

.....and what about our Seniors for the third year in a row......Champions!!

Congratulations to you all from the Tin Shedders.

None of this would happen without great management and administration, so to Peter Zuill and all his team....well done.

Finally, our thanks go again to Kate, Jess, Richard, Kim, Jo and all the cafe staff for another year of great meals and service.

## **Facilities**

We have had a great year with our café and catering, considering we had the worst weather to finish spring off and start summer with, which really knocked our sales around.

With the amount of food and beverage we are turning over now, it was necessary to build a new cold room and freezer which has helped us with keeping all our produce fresh, cold and secure. The cold room and freezer let us get better leverage on purchases (saving \$\$\$) while reducing staff costs and helped improve our overall efficiency. We also had an ice machine donated to us which saved us around \$10k in the 7 months before it died on us.

In general most hospitality venues throughout SA are down in turnover of an average of between 10 to 15%. With that in mind and the fact that the first few months lacked any incentive for anyone to come to the beach we have been able to increase our sales by \$268,025 for the year which is a 19% increase on the record year previously set. I must state this has only been possible with the help from Paul Rafanelli and Dave Afford not only this year but for many previous years (thanks guys)

The most pleasing aspect of the year has been the ability of Kate to take on new challenges and build a great senior team with the support of all her promising junior staff, we have lifted the standard of food and service taking us to a new level of which we will continue to keep doing. We as a club have been putting Kate through a hospitality course over the past 18 months. This has given Kate the ability to put her studies into practice, of which we can now all see the results.

Kate and I will continue to make the effort to increase our profit and standards of our club. With the above team working together we have been able to take our overall profit in 2015/16 from \$130,299 or 9% of turnover to \$230,590 or 13.5% of turnover.

I am looking forward to Kate and I going into our next year with positivity from this year and further benefits to the club. So to Kate, her senior staff and all the junior staff, thank you for all your work this year.

The result is a great achievement for any business, it looks to me as though, as a club, we are kicking goals everywhere and it is very pleasing to see the support that everyone is giving the café and in return the club.

Let's keep it up and bring our friends to spread the word.

## **Strategy and Partnerships**

Once again West Beach has been prominent in establishing a prominent profile in the Adelaide community. We have numerous community groups which we have partnered up with to ensure the whole community can benefit from these wonderful causes.

Below is an overview of our partnerships

#### Pink and Blue swim

National Breast Cancer Foundation and Breast Cancer Network of Australia

The Pink Swim is a non-competitive open water swim where 100% of the entry fee is donated directly to the National Breast Cancer Foundation. West Beach held our third Pink Swim in support of the National Breast Cancer Network and the Breast Cancer Network of Australia in 2015 and we have now raised in excess of \$47,500. The Pink Swim has grown in 5 years from 80 participants in 2013 to a high 601 participants.

#### CALD Group

On The Same Wave is a project that engages with South Australians from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds (CALD) and provides them with surf safety education. The program focuses on school groups and new migrants. Many participants in West Beach SLSC's program have gone on to join the club and obtain their SRC and Bronze Medallion.

Presently Peter Taylor is training 18 people from the cognise area who are training to be lifesavers (this may take anywhere from 12 months to two years to complete)

#### Surf awareness

We deliver free surf sports/nipper-style programs to children up to 17 years old as part of the City of Charles Sturt's School Holiday Sports Program.

#### Bike SA

Bike SA free bike hire program: The Club has become a part of this program and stores and hires out free bikes for tourists, visitors or locals. This program has been very successful. Given our location of the foreshore, we are pleased to welcome visitors to the club who take advantage of the free, well maintained bikes, who can cycle along the beachfront, a distance of approximately 70 km.

#### <u>Rotary</u>

The Rotary Club of Kidman Park utilises the West Beach SLSC rooms as its base and we work closely with them on fundraising events both for the community and for the club itself.

#### Henley RSL

The Henley RSL has engaged with the club and asked West Beach to support them at occasions such as Remembrance Day and Anzac Day. From this, a relationship developed and we have been able to support them by re-typing their Remembrance Day booklet and assisting them with word processing.

#### <u>SSASTA</u>

SSASTA (South Australian Aboriginal Sports Training Academy): West Beach has established a firm relationship with this group and have supported them by providing our club rooms as theirs, when they are in Adelaide. We host them for meals (charging a minimal amount of \$10 per person), run a BBQ and make them feel welcome whilst they are in Adelaide. The group is supported by the Department for Education and Child Development and they hope to continue to receive our support.

#### Supporting sport

Saint Michaels Netball Club has just started to use the West Beach SLSC as its base during its season (winter) and for presentation evenings. This relationship has been very positive and they are grateful to have the use of our club rooms at no cost whatsoever.

#### Senior members

The club supports its most senior members the "Tin Shedders" by providing them with uniforms and monthly lunch. The Tin Shedders run the BBQ at Bunnings and have successfully raised \$68,000.00 since 2012. They receive the sausages from a very valued sponsor and have cooked (they estimate) 32,000 sausages!

#### Marion Masters long swim State Championships

West Beach hosted the Open Water Marion Masters long swim State Championships and provided water cover as well as our facilities to support them with this event. Following the event we provided a BBQ and opened up our rooms for their use.

#### <u>Trailblazer</u>

Trailblazer by the Sea was a new ultra-running event run in conjunction with SLSSA and Adelaide Rotary. We supported by providing support along the leg of the trail that went past our club, and provided first aid and drinks.

#### <u>Nipperthon</u>

The Nipperthon is an endurance event for junior life savers that was held for many years at the southern clubs of Adelaide. When this event ceased, West Beach initiated its return and continues to successfully hold the event in the January school holidays. The event attracts around 150 junior lifesavers and provides them with a challenging endurance event. The entry fee has remained at \$15 per competitor and we source exciting prizes for the age group winners and medallions for all participants.

On behalf of the West Beach Surf Lifesaving Club, I would like to acknowledge our sponsors over the past season. Thanks to your generous support we have been able to provide training equipment, education programs, competition support at a State and National level and most importantly, service to our local community by the patrolling our beautiful beach on the Adelaide shoreline to keep it safe.

We sincerely hope our partnerships will be maintained and to continue to support us in our future endeavours.

Another Season is done and dusted! A very big thank you goes out to all patrolling members, Patrol Captains and Vice Captains. Welcome to the new Bronze, ARTC and SRC members and I look forward to seeing you all put your newly found skills to the test during patrols in season 2017/2018.

The Season started off with rather unpleasant conditions due to the storms that caused our water to look uninviting. With advice from SLSSA and continual monitoring of the water we did not put up the flags until the water cleared up which ended up being early November.

We had a few changes to our patrol obligations this season with earlier starting time of 12pm and also the introduction of Surveillance Patrols (9am until 12pm) for the month of January. We were able to fulfil our obligation and feedback in regards to the changes has been mostly positive.

West Beach hosted many special events again this year like Marion Masters Long Swim, Nipperthon, The Pink and Blue Swim and also Masters State Titles. All events proved again to run smoothly even though we did face a couple of shark sightings during 2 of the special events. All of those involved handled themselves well under pressure and we continued to keep the public safe. Events like these couldn't be possible without the continuing support, collaboration and hard work from those involved. Thanks to all who gave up their own time to help with our Radio room obligations this season. This was the clubs last year that we had to provide volunteers to operate. It will now be handled by an internal Surf Com Operations Group which is seeking Expressions of Interest. If you are interested in applying please contact myself for further details.

We purchased 6 new radios during 2016 and 2017 – this was crucial as the state is going digital next season and our old radios would not have been compatible. The new radios are fantastic and are much easier to hear and operate. The old radios that are still functional will be reconfigured to operate only on channel 1 for training purposes and also for use during special events.

Thank you to Kirsten Winton for being the First Aid Officer this season again. Her constant checking and restocking of the First Aid kits and stocks, has made our club that little bit more organised and prepared in case of an emergency. Our powercraft area was problematic as we faced a season with an ATV that has seen better days due to the harsh conditions that it is in. A big thank you to Dave Hann from Scoot Around who has helped us get out of the woods without having to spend big dollars. Thank you to Darren Tinkham for continuing the maintenance and upkeep of the powercraft area.

Thank you to Dennis Hay for his tireless efforts when it comes to our internal patrol audits. He puts in lots of time and effort to conduct our internal audits, he has a great attitude when it comes to assessing us all and informing us of updates so we can keep our knowledge up to date. Another close year this year, and again well done to Alpha Patrol for taking out Best Patrol.

Last season WBSLSC took out the Patrol Efficiency award for the State and as a result we won \$1500. The money went towards the purchase of our patrol trailer which was designed in-house in collaboration with the manufacturer and the final product seems to be working really well. It has certainly reduced the set up and pack up time.

Once again thank you to all those who attended their patrols, helped with water cover, first aid assistance, work party and those that helped make the special events that we held such a success.



- <u>Signals</u>: 2 lots of five
- <u>Theory paper</u>: 20 multiple choice questions.
- <u>Practical Rescue Scenario</u>- Board rescue of an unconscious patient and treatment

The group this year consisted primarily of return nippers from last year although we did have some new comers who integrated very quickly into the program.

While still including play, participation and fun, this season we focussed more on refining the skills in the following areas:

- Safety we included a safety talk at the start of every lesson but in addition to this, we also included
  - education on first aid basics including a tour of the first aid room and a show and tell by the patrolling life savings showing us

all the equipment on patrol and what it is used for ,

- what to do in an emergency
- Demonstration of how lifesavers approach a drowning patient and how they protect their own safety in doing so
- Wellness we included discussions on the benefits of exercise and good nutrition and what the basics of good nutrition is.
- Beach skills We practised the correct techniques for flags from the start position the get up and the dive as well as relay baton changeovers. Sprinting technique was refined to improve speed and we included conditioning exercising that would improve our performance in flags and sprints. We even ended some sessions with a parent and child race where the kids got a head start – the kids loved this and to be honest some of the parents did too!!!
- Water skills We practised the 50m swim without stopping and although some kids found this hard they improved over the season by using the bubble, bubble, breathe routine. They all became a lot more comfortable with keeping the head down in the water and the body parallel to the surface of the water. One of our nippers (Isabella) did achieve her redpatch.
- Boards we continued to practice technique in the prone position, making sure we were keeping our fingers together, hands cupped. Some kids started to practice paddling with both arms at the one time and kicking to keep rhythm. Most kids struggled when the surf was quite big however we did show them how to "pop" the board over the waves or in very rough conditions to roll under the waves. Wading was practiced by kicking the feet out to the side and using the arms for power through the deeper water.
- Teamwork We had a few discussions about the importance of team work and I think the team bonded well together for the most part. The kids from previous seasons were very good in welcoming and including the new kids which was lovely to see. We ended each session with our huddle up for TEAM AWESOME which I think makes the kids feel very much part of a team.

We had a good group of kids with a good turn out each week. Usually around 15 kids with a core group of about 10 kids who turned up nearly every week.





#### Award statistics 2016-17



This year we held Advanced Resuscitation proficiencies prior to the October start of the season when the upstairs training room is more available and concentrated on the water based awards during the summer months. There was a significant number of members that did not attend these sessions and were not proficient in ARTC during the patrol season. The availability of a training room during the summer limits class room trainings to Monday nights which clashes with board training which limits attendance of junior patrolling members. At the end of the season ARTC award training session was held on Tuesday nights after ski training and this combined with the Cert III award requirements resulted in a large attendance of school age bronze members. We had good attendance at the Surf Lifesaving Search and Rescue courses during the season with 17

West Beach members completing this award. This award should be encouraged for all Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, IRB driver and Crew in the club.



We had 31 new bronze members this season as we have a restriction on the availability and number of bronze trainers willing to take a group. The breakdown of bronze award this season show approx 2/3 are new members and the remainder are SRC members continuing to the bronze award. With the recognition of the Certificate III in Public Safety assisting student Year 12 ATAR the club has an opportunity of increasing and maintaining its youth membership.



#### Ski Area

The 2016/17 season has proven to be one of our strongest ever. The ski squad has been especially strong across all aspects of competition this season, from the Board and Ski Series to State Titles. With an increasing squad size, we were able to strongly contest both individual and team ski races in every age group. This growth and the continued success of the squad is a testament to both the positive team atmosphere West Beach prides itself on, and the unwavering commitment demonstrated by its paddlers.

Ski events at State Titles were raced on the Saturday in essentially flat conditions. There were no opportunities for lucky (or unlucky) waves, therefore the competitors were unassisted on the way in and had to rely on their own stamina to get them over the line. In the Open Women's age group the entire female training squad successfully qualified through to the final. Cat McArthur claimed gold, followed by Brittany Jessup in silver.

The Open Men's age group saw West Beach claim a clean sweep of medals. Gold was awarded to Glenn Rypp, followed by Chris Kither and Owen Mcleod. Zac Ryan also achieved a top six finish. The open men are renowned for an abundance of fiercely competitive and talented ski paddlers, and always have multiple teams on the line for the ski relay. Although team combinations were a change from the previous year the West Beach men produced solid performances and stormed home to collect gold and silver.

The U17 and U19 age groups also celebrated success. In the U17 men's race Jesse Ellis produced a stellar performance to claim gold. Lachie Boag also contested strongly in the U17 race and came 4<sup>th</sup>. He is a relatively new ski paddler already showing remarkable talent. Another talented paddler in her debut season is Alyson Hettner. Despite not having years of ski paddling experience Aly is already demonstrating strength and technique, with these attributes leading her to achieve silver in the U17 women's race. Another standout performance was in the U19 women's final, where Kelsey Goldner claimed gold.

In addition to the outstanding results achieved in the individual ski and ski relays, West Beach also produced impressive performances in both the mixed and gender specific double ski events. A highlight was the spectacular comeback of Glenn Rypp and Cat McArthur in the Open Mixed Double Ski Final. Despite an unlucky start which saw both paddlers in the water while the other combinations sped off, they blazed through the field and triumphed with gold. Another notable success in this event is Ben Zuill and Emma Perry claiming the bronze medal. Open Mixed double ski is not only entertaining but is also a very competitive event with dozens of teams nominated, and it was fantastic that West Beach had so many talented paddlers on the line.

Although it is disappointing to have the Aussies cancelled prior to racing in the individual ski events, the West Beach ski paddlers should continue striving for success and use this as motivation for the upcoming season. Results in the recent State Titles indicate that West Beach can become a force to be reckoned with on a National level.

On behalf of the squad I sincerely thank all the coaches who have given up their time to coach skis this year. Steve Perry, Greg Perry and Peter Zuill have worked tirelessly to get the best out of each and every athlete. I also commend the senior

athletes who stepped up and coached sessions when required.

All the ski competitors should be very proud with the way they conducted themselves this season. Whilst training and racing individuals have shown excellent sportsmanship and a never-give up attitude. We have set the standard of ski paddling in South Australia, and we will continue to be the club to beat for seasons to come.

This year, the Ski Area Award was again presented to Glenn Rypp, recognising his great results throughout the



season and his impact in setting the standard for the Ski Squad.

### Swim Area Report

Once again, we have seen a huge improvement in quality and quantity of swimmers at the surf club. Our swim area now ranges from those at a national final level to those who come out every Saturday afternoon to participate in the club swim, regardless of conditions. The club's ability to guide new young swimmers into high level squads, through nippers and pool sessions, continues to prove itself with young members joining strong swimming squads around the state. This gives great confidence in the future of the swim area and shows that we will continue our current success in years to come.

On day 1 of State Titles we showed our strength across belt and tube swims, coming away with two gold, five silver and three bronze medals. Dominance was shown by our female competitors, taking five of the top six in the open rescue tube rescue, four of the top six in under 17 belt and three of the top six in the under 19 rescue tube rescue. The youth males Harry Dawkins and James Borlase also made their presence known taking home gold and silver in the under 15 rescue tube race.

Day 2 and 3 the focus of the swim area was on the surf race and surf teams, along with other events that incorporated a swim leg. Between surf races and surf teams, West Beach collected five gold, eight silver, two bronze and ten fourth to sixth placings. The open women were able to show their depth once again by coming home with four of the six fastest individual swimmers and three of the top six surf teams. Swimmers Abbey Jones and Gretel Mead controlled their surf races, Abbey winning open, Gretel winning under 17s and placing second to Abbey in the opens. In the men's area there were some team changes on the day. Aiden Lock and Lachie Holt were both scheduled to move up for the open male surf team, but after already racing in their age groups it was agreed that they earned a break and their positions were covered by Jayden Ellis and Zac Ryan, and the team finished strong in second place. Ben Zuill came away with a silver in the open surf race in a strong run up the beach and confirmed his swimming strength with a massive swim in the Lifesaver relay, setting the team up for a win.

Unfortunately, the final stage of the season was cut short on the Gold Coast due to cyclone Debbie. This was unfortunate after such a successful season, but we didn't waste the races we did get to compete in. At the senior competition, our under 17s; Gretel Mead, Alyson Hettner, Laura Fox and Leah Jones, made the under 17 surf team final and Open Females; Abbey Jones, Caitlin Sheehy, Brittany Jessup and Gretel Mead, made the Open Surf Team final.

As seen from our results, the club is thriving in the swim area. Our swimmers are continually growing and hanging around, ready to put their hands up to fill in for teams when needed. We are competitive at a national level and in 18 months we will be ready to compete on the world stage in our own backyard.

This season the Swim Award was presented to Gretel Mead. Her results across multiple Age Groups and also at the highest levels of

competition in Surf Lifesaving are a credit to her.




