





Finance


Another strong financial year, with strong sales activity the "Clubs" asset and financial position continues to grow with our revenue reaching a record \$2,293,263.57 up \$207,201.15 on 2018

The club building fund currently sits at \$278,881.63 this number is made up largely by the Café Profit and general club Fundraising activities.

The "Cafe" has had a very strong year with turnover of \$2,044,220.65, an increase of \$196,550.00 over 2018 generating an operating profit of \$320,490.38, an increase of \$53,120.96 over the 2018 result. With an operating profit of 15.67 % the café becomes are major fundraising arm. Credit for the sales and profit growth again must be given to both Kate and Norm for their diligence in not only looking at ways to grow revenue but also overall expense control. The Café closing inventory sits at \$42,176.40.

Clothing and merchandise returned a profit of \$9,820.51. A fantastic result as the last few years clothing returned a loss, an exciting turn around.

The Surf Club has invested in the new Beachside Restaurant aiming for another revenue stream providing a loan of \$159,067.80 to get that Business up and running.






Asset expenditure this year was \$91,221.77 with area breakdown expenditure listed below.

The above, and numerous other items, resulted in the "Surf Club" generating a Total Current Asset position of \$721,683.28. An increase of \$219,0043.96 over the previous year.

Overall the Surf Club has again shown great restraint in spending, resulting in a cash position of \$611,915.30, a nett increase of \$203,966.39 over 2018. Fantastic work by all.

Strategy and Compliance

Strategy and Compliance is a new position which has been created to help governance and decision-making within the club.

It is a fair question to ask why a new position is required when the club has operated successful thus far? However the creation of the role is the result of the club's growth and development:

- in respect of Compliance, the club and its operations are more complex and with broader obligations. Adherence to an expanded compliance remit is necessary to allow our operations to continue; protect the club, our members, employees and others who interact with our activities.
- on Strategy; strategy is important so members' efforts and club resources are not wasted, but directed towards West Beach SLSC delivering for its members, sponsors and the beach-going public.

The club's development has brought new opportunities, greater resources and resourcing

obligations as well as decisions and challenges arising from our location and community profile. The development and implementation of a new strategy is desirable to guide decision-making and initiative towards the objectives our club wants to meet.

What does success look like for West Beach Surf Lifesaving Club?

The starting point for a strategy is agreeing an end-point: where is it that we wish to go as a club?

Executive members were asked to consider this through the question "What does success look like for West Beach Surf Lifesaving Club?

Analysis of approximately 60 'signs of success' nominated, showed strong consensus around 5 outcomes. This has provided the vision of success our strategy will be developed to address.

Success for West Beach looks like a club which has:

.... a strong club base with growth in members, their awards and their contribution

....respected lifesaving services

...that is Financially Independent

with a new club building and the facilities and equipment it needs

and a culture and record of achievement in Surf Sports

ind a culture and record of achievement in 3011 3ports

... and is known as a leader within the surf lifesaving movement and its community

...growing in numbers, especially bronze holders and juniors, other award holders and with members keen to share the load

.... providing a safe beach and lifesaving services that are relied upon

having financial resources and strength to execute our plans for the club

....for its goals in lifesaving, surf sports, financial independence and community presence and contribution

supported by quality coaching and a culture that attracts, supports and challenges athletes to participate and excel

through its enterprising and outward-looking initiatives in surf and community events, its work within its communities and in training and development of young people.

The next stage planned for the coming year is the development of a strategy to help guide the club towards these objectives.

Members' contributions are encouraged to contribute ideas and lessons from experience which can help improve its effectiveness and retain what we do well towards these goals. Please do not hesitate to contact the writer of this report with your thoughts and experience.

Compliance

Compliance is something that has been ongoing within and throughout the club through the conduct of its normal operations. The purpose of board oversight has been to introduce some whole-of-club oversight to the various compliance requirements and to provide support.

The starting point has been comparison against the Surf Life Saving Australia's club compliance checklist – with the club measuring up well. There are of course more extensive requirements driven by the various activities the club operates and these are assessed separately and through club officers concerned. One of these is the annual health and safety inspection conducted by Council, which the club satisfied, with a handful of minor points to address prior to the next inspection. These have been documented and are being addressed.

Commercial Operations

Our Café hit over \$2 million in sales this year which is pretty remarkable considering people had a hard time getting parking near us with the car park being either cut to a third of its capacity or totally shut for the building of the rock wall. I would have thought we are pretty close to our maximum in sales for this venue with the limitations we have for service and producing meals. Food prices went through the roof this year due to drought, which knocked us around in the first part of the year and it looks as though the same will happen this year with droughts and floods in QLD killing over 1 million head of stock.

The club has a contract which has been in place for just over 4 years with CUB which gives us a rebate on all stock we buy from them. This enables us to keep prices down and keep our gross cost of liquor to about 35% of sales. This is about the standard for most front bars. We did find the rebate had not been applied for about 4 years and, as a result, received about \$24,000 (GST inc). It now comes off every bill as we go. This isn't reflected in the cafés profit for this year but in general revenue. Our café profit was about \$310,000, up from about \$267,000 last year.

Kate has held onto and built a strong team which is reflected in our sales, it is quite remarkable the standard of food and the speed of service we get from the kitchen we have. Well done to the whole team. We tried to open on Mondays for the whole year and have consequently found this is a money losing idea, we just can't get enough customers in to justify the costs and won't be doing it again this year. Having the water closer to the balcony has worked well for sales as it has given us the feeling you are on the beach and not at it (be nice if we could get the sand problems worked on for long term).

I had the pleasure of taking over clothing in August this year and with some hard work from Rachel Bell and Kate we have this working quite well. We will be placing orders before winter to make sure we receive our stock. We did a lot of items on pre-order which meant we didn't need to hang on to unnecessary stock (we are going to do a pre-order of some hoodies very soon). Rachel has offered to do the clothing again this year which I want to thank her and the team she has built on behalf of the whole club.

For Worlds, Jo Varney worked on a design and a pre order system that worked very well thank you Jo all very efficient and no excess stock. Our clothing this year has given us a profit of about \$9,500 compared to about a \$4,000 loss last year.

The Board had the opportunity to get the old Salsa restaurant at a good price. This venue is to work in synergy with the club and let us service more customers and members in our local area, this gives us a safety net for the future development of our club. Beachside has been working well and we have had a great write up in the paper and great feedback from customers. It has been a difficult venture, staffing wise has been problem after problem and we are hoping this will all settle down nicely we have a good team in place. As with most businesses near the beach it will be seasonal which will mean we run it tight over winter and prosper in summer.

This is YOUR restaurant and we would love the support from all members and families, especially over the coming months. The Board does a review every month with a long term plan to sell it as an ongoing concern with all profits from the sale going entirely to the club. So come and join us there and help West Beach Surf Life Saving Club stay ahead of the rest.

CALD Group

We deliver free surf sports/nipper-style programs to children up to 17 years old as part of the City of Charles Sturt's School Holiday Sports Program.

Rotary

The Rotary Club of Kidman Park utilises the West Beach SLSC rooms as its base and we work closely with them on fundraising events both for the community and for the club itself. The Rotary club donated a defibrillator for the West Beach Surf Club Café and worked in unison for a wine fundraiser (raised \$3,000)

SSASTA

SSASTA (South Australian Aboriginal Sports Training Academy): West Beach has established a firm relationship with this group and has supported them by providing our club rooms as theirs, when they are in Adelaide. We host them for meals (charging a minimal amount of \$10 per person), run a BBQ and make them feel welcome whilst they are in Adelaide. The group is supported by the Department for Education and Child Development and they hope to continue to receive our support.

The West Beach club had the pleasure in training SSASTA elite netball squad in surf and beach skills.

Tin Shedders

To our greatest fundraisers. The Tin Shedders run the BBQ at Bunnings and have successfully raised close to \$100,000 since 2012. Their tireless work has been so beneficial in giving us opportunities to purchase much needed resources and equipment.



Trailblazer

Trailblazer by the Sea was a new ultra-running event run by Adelaide Rotary. We assisted by providing support along the leg of the trail that went past our club by providing a first aid and drinks station.

Nipperthon

The Nipperthon is an endurance event for junior life savers that was held for many years at the southern clubs of Adelaide. When this event ceased, West Beach initiated its return and continues to successfully hold the event in the January school holidays. The event attracts around 200 junior lifesavers and provides them with a challenging endurance event. Exciting prizes are sourced for the age group winners and medallions for all participants.



Education and Training

In the 2018/2019 season, significant changes were made to the delivery of the Bronze Medallion Certificate. The Bronze medallion is our foundation award that assures our community that our life savers are rescue ready, prepared to respond to any emergency they may face when on the beach (or possibly in the broader community) and that they are highly skilled lifesavers who can attend to an incident or emergency quickly and effectively.

There is a high standard expected for training our many awards and following the Australian Skills and Quality Authority (ASQA) Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs), Surf Life Saving SA (SLSSA) conducted an internal review in September 2017. Areas for improvement were identified around the delivery and assessment of the Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) and these were communicated to the SLSSA Board. In January 2018 the SLSSA Board made the decision to maintain our status as an RTO and therefore improve the quality of the Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue). This decision supports the requirement by Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) that if a member patrols with a Bronze Medallion, that member must also have the Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue).

The training and assessment strategy for the SLSSA Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) has been updated to include formal assessment of skills and knowledge which was previously largely undocumented. While minimal change has occurred for the content of training, additional assessment evidence has been developed along with the introduction of a logbook to be completed on patrol. This has seen major changes to the award assessment and proficiency process within Surf Lifesaving with SLSA introducing a compulsory online theory component for proficiencies and SLSSA trialling bulk assessments for Bronze awards.

Coupled with the changes to the Bronze Medallion, our few club assessors, to maintain their certification, are required to adhere to the amendments to the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment qualification as required by the Federal Government. These updates, if not 2019, will see their completed by July qualifications cease and they are no longer able to be a recognised club assessor. To comply, assessors must complete additional modules of the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment including the 'Design and develop assessment tools' and 'Address adult language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) skills. These changes will require an additional (5 to 10 full days) offsite training plus a minimum of some 40 hours of course work assignments. It is a serious commitment.

Proficiencies

Due to the large number of members who are required to achieve their proficiencies and the few trainers and assessors we have, we decided to split the proficiencies into "dry" (signals / CPR / Radio) and "water" (run/swim/run and rescue) sections. This would enable the assessors to split their time and hopefully reduce their commitment on the beach. We held several sessions at the West Beach Primary School Hall and then followed up with the water sessions once the season commenced.

These would not be possible without the hard work of our assessors and I sincerely thank them for their time, effort and commitment. Without them, we would not have active patrolling members or competitors and we are always looking for additional help in education. Please don't be afraid to come forward and assist with any training.

She competed in under 17, 19 and open races and placed 2nd in the under 17 board race and 5th in the open board race. It was fantastic to see multiple crews performing well on world and national stages.

A few of many season highlights:

- Open Female crew 'Coasters' Top 6 finish in inaugural Australian Short Course title – only beaten by eventual gold and silver medallist
- Three crews competing at Aussies
- Top 16 result for U23 Male at Aussies (ranked in Top 8 before injury finished campaign prematurely)
- Top 20 result for Reserve Female (also 'Coasters') at Aussies
- 200 Female 'Spritzers' narrowly missing a first Aussie surfboat medal for West Beach

It was also great to see the continued development of so many rowers and sweeps. Whether it was a 15 year old getting into a surfboat for the first time or a 60 year old rowing at Middleton and getting to trail oars for the first time, there were first time challenges and opportunities being taken across our group.

And it is a huge group, we had nearly 70 rowers compete for West Beach during the season.

Australian Titles - April 2019 - Broadbeach, QLD

Although it was exciting to have the World titles so close to home, for surfboats the Australian

titles remains the pre-eminent event on the calendar.

It was really pleasing to see three West Beach crews head to Broadbeach on the Gold Coast for the 2019 Aussies.

The week started with Master competition in windy and challenging conditions. A top 4 result for the Spritzers 200F crew (Tracy Rafanelli, Briony Goodfellow, Sharon Reinke, Sarah Nash, Peter Snell - sweep) is sensational. To our knowledge it is the best ever result for a West Beach boat crew at Aussies. Behind the scenes, the crew knows that it finished top 3 in both their races and would almost certainly have been in the medals but for a technical issue that prevented them competing in the first race.

The Coasters (Rhea Bergmann, Marley Fairclough, Kylie McBain, Holly Batty, Colin Lindsay - guest sweep) competed in the inaugural Open Female Short Course Surfboat event. The conditions worsened as the week progressed with only 7 of 18 starters able to complete the course. In almost every surfboat competition ever, top 3 gets you through to the next round. However, for this event, the conditions were so challenging the referees decided to take only two from each heat through to the 6 boat final. Coasters were just edged out of 2nd place in their heat so were inches away from an Australian final. They came an unofficial 6th place as only 3 crews qualified from the other two heats. Usually competing in an event where the only crews that beat you are the silver and gold medalists gets you on the podium. Notwithstanding that, we are super proud of how the Coasters performed.

The surf cleaned up but got bigger by the time long course racing commenced featuring both the Coasters (with regular sweep Scott Fitzgerald) in Reserve Female and IndecentSea (with Somerton rower Adam Perry replacing Lachlan Holt) in U23 Male.

Both crews did exceptionally well on the Saturday, with great results in the round robin section to move through to the elimination rounds.

The Coasters' campaign came to an end late on Saturday in the minor quarter finals giving them an excellent Top 20 result and strong improvement on their 2018 outing.

InDecentSea performed strongly in their minor quarter final, coming 2nd. This meant that they entered finals day on Sunday ranked =5th of the 16 crews. Unfortunately, a rollover in warm up on Sunday morning resulted in a broken foot for the crews' stroke rower and they had to withdraw. A disappointing finale to a campaign that had them showing they could match it with the elite. With two more years in U23s, this is a young crew with great potential.

Masters

From this point, the female boaties have all been warm, welcoming and supportive of each other, there-by growing their area by about one boat every two years. This season, this was demonstrated by Mel DB and Sarah Price encouraging and supporting some new nipper bronzey mum's Jenni Carberry and Nicola Ross to row a surf boat. I watched them row at States and was truly impressed with their improvement and skill!

12 years ago, Lisette was one of the only masters women who attended senior club training. But when Briony started to train, Lisette welcomed and supported her. One session, Briony lost her ski and had to swim to shore, leaving her quite uncertain, but Lisette supported her to return to the water by promising to paddle next to her until Briony felt comfortable again. A promise that she rigorously kept. In turn, Briony has welcomed and supported Glenda to senior training sessions, and now they both paddle in circles waiting for me to get back on my ski for the 54th time! Not to mention, welcoming Leila, Sandy Conroy, Deb Wareing and Jo S to board training sessions.

From Lisette, Briony, myself and some of the then new masters boaties, the masters women's group grew significantly with the arrival of Sarah Goodwin, and her warm, supportive and encouraging nature. Sarah not only encouraged and supported the masters women, but also the younger female members of the club. In particular, Sarah supported and encouraged Kate Curtis and Jess Ireland, who now, in their turn, are supporting and encouraging a younger generation of female West Beachies.

Due to different life commitments, masters competitors are not always able to come to senior club sessions, and perhaps think that training sessions are preferable when finished with coffee (or a beer). Hence, there are a few separate masters groups that train at the club. One of these is the Saturday and Sunday morning ski paddle group, with stalwarts Lisette, Don and Jake, who welcome anyone wanting to paddle with them. This group regularly grows to include Paul Raff, Brad, Norm, Barney, Richo, Leila, myself and Peter Fox, and has significantly improved the ski paddling ability of the masters club members.
