Compliance and Marketing

Christine Newberry again managed the very important area of Compliance along with the portfolio of Partnerships this year. Each year the amount of compliance work required to keep the Club running increases.

Strategy and Risk

Jon Westover joined the Board this season and was primarily focussed on updating the Clubs Strategic

Plan. This is being rolled out to members now and is a timely milestone as we prepare to take over occupancy in the new Club Facility.

Lifesaving Operations

This season the portfolios of Lifesaving Services and Education and Training were taken on by Ellen Newberry in her first time on the Board. As with other Operational areas in the club, these services were significantly impacted by the club redevelopment.

Facilities

Ben Lawrance continued in the Facilities role and had the huge challenge this year in managing the exit from the old club rooms and the setup of our facilities at Beachside. A great achievement by Ben to get this done so smoothly. The challenge this season is to complete the move back into the new facility.

Youth Development

This was Sarah's first year on the Board and in the role of Director of Youth Development. This was a challenging year for the Nippers due to the club redevelopment and involved having to work from trailers each Saturday.

Surf Sports

Another successful year in Surf Sports overseen by Jenni Carberry once again. West Beach again performed well at both State and National levels of competition with good representation on the State Teams and the National Surf League Teams.





Finance

Financial income for the 2022/2023 season was significantly impacted by the demolishing of the old Club and the subsequent write-off of a large number of Assets as well as the limited trading period of May to July.

The Café showed a turnover this year of \$652,705 generating an operating profit of \$44,135. This is still quite a good result given the closure of the Café from July 2022.

Entire Club Revenue this season was \$2,840,556, primarily due to the council contributions to the new Club Build.

Facilities



Wow, what a year for Facilities and the West Beach Surf Club. We were getting over Covid and deciding on the best contractor for the rebuild at the beginning of the year. Then we had to move, and move we did. In July 2022 all the plans moving from our old club to Beachside actually worked. It could not have been completed if it wasn't for the dedication and comradery of our Club members.

Who would ever consider taking apart a cool room and reassembling it in another location? No one is the answer, however, we did it. What a sensational effort this was. The rumours are false, we are not taking it to the new club. The day of the move, many members made themselves available to take every item from the club to Beachside in a conga line procession along West Beach Road.

The transition to Beachside went smoothly for our Commercial facility. New bar was built, cool room and feezer dismantled and reassembled, kitchen was revamped, containers moved and our members had a new interim facility to continue as a community hub for them and the general public.

The transition of all our life saving equipment was another major issue. Our main shed was full, so we had to find somewhere for everything to go. We left our old club that was home for 59 years half way through the 2022 year and consolidated our commercial operations at our Beachside Restaurant.

Our main focus to do this was to keep a base for a club so we could keep and strengthen our club ethos and culture. It does appear this has happened due to the support of each and every one of our members.

Our main focus is on lifting our standards whilst being very conscious we are a family club and want our prices to reflect that now and going forward as well as raise and keep enough income to pay of future costs for a new club with our focus being on keeping our lifesaving, equipment standards and training at a level that no others have (as we have the passion to do this). I would like to thank all our staff for the efforts they have put in. Whilst they are paid, please don't lose sight that they all go above and beyond what most employees will do and are passionate about our/their club.

Compliance and Partnerships

Compliance and governance are hugely complex areas involving many facets of the law, both State and Federally and navigation in a volunteer organisations is often difficult. We are a member of Clubs SA Clubs SA which is the official industry body representing the interests of licensed Clubs in this State. Clubs SA's major platform has been to effect change to government legislation to enable Clubs to become more self-sufficient over the long term, and to provide a recognised infrastructure for the active support and promotion of sport and community events across the Club industry.

As a Club, we adhere to a variety of State and National legislation including managing and comply with the Children Protection Act 1993 and follow the requirements with Working with Children Checks (WWCC) managed by the Department of Human Services. Their website has been recently amended and now states:

Working With Children Check

Clubs and associations with significant membership or involvement of children

All workers and volunteers need a Working with Children Check regardless of whether they have direct contact with children.

Compliance

Compliance means we are governed by laws, and we must comply with them.

In 2022/2023 we have achieved full compliance with SLSSA's requirements regarding SLSA Member Protection Policy 6.05 WWCC and NPC Requirements.

We submitted 88 WWCC on behalf of our members and have recorded 168 WWCC and registered an interest in these volunteers via the Department of Human Services portal.

What this means is that there is a direct notification process between the club and the DHS after a WWCC is granted. Any information sources

(from bodies including SA Police and Department for Child Protection) monitor any new information relevant to a person's check status and the club would be notified a person's clearance status is changed or revoked, versus the club relying on an individual to complete this notification process.

In terms of how we operate as a club and a board, we are very aware of our transparency.

In simplest terms, transparency means having nothing to hide. This means a business will allow its processes and transactions observable to outsiders. It also makes necessary disclosures, informs everyone affected about its decisions, and complies with legal requirements. We have implemented new processes such as having National Police Checks for key volunteers who partake in financial transactions for the club. Transparency is a critical component for governance because it ensures all our actions can be checked at any given time by an outside makes observer. This its processes and transactions verifiable, so if a question does come up about a step, we can provide a clear answer. All stakeholders and members have the right to know about the direction we are headed.

Accountability

It takes more than transparency to build integrity. It also takes accountability. Accountability can have a negative connotation because many people associate it with blame. "Who's responsible for when something goes wrong?" - but accountability is more than that. It's about having ownership over one's actions whether the consequences are good or bad. Accountability covers not only failings, but also accomplishments. Our strategic planning gives us transparency and accountability.

The Board is responsible for taking all reasonable steps to ensure that the law is observed. We do this by establishing and following proper procedures that, if followed, would be effective in preventing legal breaches (as a worst case).



In August, we held our annual family quiz night, which along with our information session in September provided a great way for our families to connect ahead of the start of the season.

Pink and Blue Swim

The Pink and Blue team are proud to announce \$105,015 as the final total of proceeds raised as a result of our 2023 event. That's over \$500,000 raised across the last 11 events!

This year we added in a 6km run so with the choice of either a 200m, 500m, or 1km swim or 2km pet friendly walk there was something for everyone.



All proceeds raised are evenly distributed between Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia and St Andrews Hospital Breast Care Unit which funded the following projects.

St Andrews Hospital Foundation

Pink & Blue Nurse for 2023

Breast Cancer is the second most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia. Excellent Breast

Nurses with extensive knowledge and experience in the oncology field make a huge difference in a patient's cancer journey. Breast cancer patients are currently seen by our Breast Care Team, before, during and after surgery including phoning patients after discharge. For some patients, the treatment plan commences with chemotherapy, or chemotherapy and radiotherapy beginning after surgery. An additional breast care team member will enable St Andrew's to provide essential education and support in our off-site chemotherapy suite. The role would be part-time, for an initial 12-month period, with the view to making this our ongoing project.

Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia (PCFA) 2023

Evolution: Phase II Clinical Trial

Multi-million-dollar clinical trial – first of its kind in the world.

One hundred men with metastatic castrate resistant prostate cancer (mCRPC) to participate.

The Royal Adelaide Hospital is one of 7 sites taking part across Australia.

A ground-breaking new clinical trial co-funded by PCFA is set to explore the next frontier in precision medicine for prostate cancer – combining Lu-PSMA with immunotherapy. The trial will take around four years, with follow-up studies in the years following. Each patient's PSA levels will be monitored for at least 12 months following the completion of treatment.

Swim, Board, Ski and Beach Report Swim

The Open Females had a strong finish to the season with Georgia, Leah, and Leila finishing in the top 6 in both the Belt race and Surf race, Georgia taking out the Bronze and Silver respectively. The girls had Alinta join them in the Surf Teams to take out the Silver, with the B team of Edie, Stella, Jess, and Jo placing 4th. Following suit, the Youth girls also had some amazing swims with Maisy taking out Gold in the U15 Surf race, while Edie and Alinta claimed both Gold and Silver in the U16 Surf race with Zara finishing 6th. The depth in the Female swim area is very promising for the years to come!

The mens swim area continues to be held up by the younger competitors with Lachie taking home the Bronze in the Open Surf race as well as claiming Gold in both the U17 Surf race and U17 Belt race. Lachie was joined by Matt, Ben, and Aiden for the Open Surf Teams where they took home the Bronze, and he teamed up with Felix, Aiden, and Oliver to finish with a Silver in the U17 Surf Teams. Lachie's dominance in swimming this season across all types of events made him the deserving winner of the West Beach Swim Area Award for this season. There is a lot of skill coming through the Male swim area and is expected to continue to grow in the coming years with more great results to follow.

In addition to the great success at the state level this season, we also saw Georgia make her first Open Female Surf race final at Aussies where she placed 18th, out doing Matt who finished 22nd in the Male final.

As you can see, we had many great results at state titles including a lot of top three finishes. Although podium finishes are great, a successful season does not only include medal finishes but individual achievements and improvements as well. We had a season of many fantastic achievements on the beach and in the pool and we look forward to seeing what we can achieve next season.

Board

The Board area continues to be a strong group at our club both in results and attitude. This season we saw a number of outstanding performances and it is great watching all our athletes keep pushing beyond their limits year on year. Our athletes are not only pushing our squad to improve in Boards, they are also improving the quality of board paddling across the state through tough competition with great sportsmanship.

While the Male Board area does not have a lot of depth at this stage, each of our athletes finished the season with outstanding results. During the season it was great to see Matt, Felix, and Aiden competing as Board paddlers in the SA Surf League and consistently bring that quality out to Board training, helping the squad improve further. These three also finished in the top ten at State Titles in the Open Board race and teamed up to claim Bronze in the Open Board relay. There were also great results in the age group categories, with Lachie claiming Bronze in the U17 Board race and Aiden claiming Silver in the U16 Board race, however, the standout performance in the Male area this season was by Felix, claiming his age group Board title for the third year in a row. His results, along with his determination and focus throughout the season, earned Felix the West Beach Board Area Award this season. To top it off, these three teamed up to take out the U17 Board relay Gold.

The Females continue to bring depth to the training squad, keeping the sessions both competitive and entertaining. It is great to see as this group of girls becomes more competitive, they are still able to have a laugh and enjoy getting down to the beach. With this culture there is no surprise that most of their Board results came in the team events. The girls had three Open Board relays with Stella, Edie, and Leah claiming the Silver medal and the B team of Jess, Kate, and Georgia finishing fifth. This depth stretches down to the U15 and U17 Females. In the U15 Board relay Ginger, Hayley, and Maisy finished fourth, and Emma jumped into a composite team finishing ninth. In the U17 Board relay Edie, Kelsea, and Daisy claimed the Bronze, with Alinta, Hayley, and Zara not far behind placing sixth. In addition to the results in relays there were a number of outstanding individual results. In the Opens Stella, Georgia, and Kelsea finished sixth, ninth, and thirteenth, respectively. In the age group categories there were a number of top ten placings which the girls should be proud of. The highlight of the Female Board races was in the U16 final where Edie was able to claim Gold for a third year in a row and Zara finishing in third to take home the Bronze medal.

We would like to congratulate everyone on a fantastic season. It is great to see the squad developing together and continuing to strive to get the best out of themselves and each other.

The West Beach spirit shown on the beach, around the club and helping with training is nothing short of amazing. There is so much potential being realised in this group and we look forward to seeing what season 2023/24 has to offer.

Ski

The Ski area this season had a lot going on as usual. With a large group of athletes heading over to the Gold Coast to compete in the Coolangatta Gold there was a strong training group throughout the cold winter months. Preparation for the Coolie also included several athletes competing in the SA Ocean Paddlers Downwind Series where we had several great results. The dedication of the squad continued into the season with amazing improvement from the athletes and they took every opportunity throughout the season to measure their improvement.

Over the past few years our Open Male Ski area has seemed to be thinned out by the alluring Queensland Coast but once again we had a strong contingent in the Open Male Ski area with outstanding results. In the Ski final we saw Owen claim the Bronze, with Glenn not far behind in 5th. Owen and Glenn teamed up in the Open Double Ski to take home the Silver and the team of Jesse and Zac finishing in sixth. The highlight of the Male Ski area was the Ski relay, where Owen and Glenn executed an awesome first two legs setting Jesse up to come storming home to take the Gold! The younger age groups have begun to follow suit with Aiden taking home the Gold in the U16 Ski race, and then heading over to Aussies in a team with Felix and Tyler to finish seventh in the U17 Ski relay final.

The Female Ski area has been very consistent in the last few years. Once again Georgia had a strong season on skis starting the year by taking on the Coolangatta Gold long course, and many of our female paddlers improved in leaps and bounds finishing the season with some great results. In the U16 age group Edie competed in her first Ski race and took the Gold medal, while Kelsea and Daisy finished ninth and tenth respectively in the U17 Ski race. Moving into the Opens the girls entered three teams, Jess, Leila, and Georgia taking home the Silver medal, then Stella, Kelsey and Leah finishing sixth and finally Alyson, Kate and Kelsea finishing eight. In the Open Ski race Georgia had a great race just missing out on a podium finish in fourth, just behind the Ski Area Award winner Leila who claimed the Bronze medal. Leila has had an amazing year on the Ski and it is so good to see her rewarded for her efforts over the season.

Overall the Ski area is still a strong area in our club however we do not quite have the depth we have had in previous years. It is great to see the young competitors stepping up into relays and getting some great results in doing so. In the coming years we will have the opportunity to rebuild this area with both depth and quality, making the future look very bright.

Beach

This season the beach area was a smaller contingent than we have seen in the past few years. Although there are only a few athletes competing in beach events we still saw a number of outstanding results, primarily in the long distance runs. This is a testament to the effort put in by the squads beach coach, and this years Beach area award winner, Stella Benger. Over the past few seasons Stella has led the charge in the Beach area and pushed athletes to include more running in their training schedule. It is a tough position to be in doubling up as a coach and athlete but Stella has managed it well. During winter Stella pulled together a running group on Wednesday night to prepare for the Coolangatta Gold as well as in the lead up to the City to Bay Fun Run. These running sessions continued into summer after Monday night board training and prepared the squad for another successful year on the beach.

As mentioned, we had great success in the long distance events at State Titles. Starting in the Female area, Stella claimed Bronze in the Open Female 2km Beach Run, with Georgia just behind in 4th place and Kelsey finishing in 6th. Stella then teamed up with Jess to take home another Bronze in the Open Female 2x1km Beach Relay. An amazing effort from the Open Females. Aiden was holding the fort for the Male area, claiming Gold in the U16 2km Beach Run and Silver in the Open Male category. This is an outstanding result as a 16 year old. Aiden teamed up with Felix in the U17 2x1km Beach Relay to take home the Bronze and partnered up with Ben in the Opens to finish in 5th place.

Although a majority of the Beach results we see are in the distance events, we also have a couple of sprinters coming through the Youth age groups. Chantelle Hockley competed in the U14 Female Beach Sprints where she had a great run but just missed out on the final. We also have Caleb Illmer running in the U14 Male category where he finished 4th both the Beach Sprints and Flags. These are great results and we look forward to seeing how



these runners develop in the future!

Overall the Beach area is one that needs work in our club. We are starting to develop the coaching base to accommodate the potential coming through the younger age groups but we need to support those members trying to build the Beach squad wherever we can. In the coming seasons expect to see this area grow and the results will follow.

Surf Boats

The boat area award this year went to Peter Snell. Peter continues to be a driving force behind the boat area at West Beach. He sweeps and coaches juniors and masters, organises training, mentors sweeps and rows masters as well (helping a rookie masters crew to their first medal this year).

Peter sets a great example and hopefully is inspiring more of our rowers to put their hand up to spread the load.

Pool Lifesaving

Over the 1st weekend of July 53 West Beach competitors made up of 17 Nippers, 18 Youth/Open and 19 master's don the Double Blue Caps to compete in the annual Pool Rescue Champs held at the SA Aquatic Centre, led by Coach and Captain Briny McArthur.

Saturday saw the U15-Open competitors complete a few of their individual events, the 50 and 100 Manikin Carry, 100 Rescue Medley and 200 Super Lifesaver. With many of the athletes leaving Saturday with a medal. Sunday saw the rest join in. The day started with everyone's favourite event, the unpredictable Line Throw. This year we saw 13 teams finish in the top 3.

We got to witness Seacliff's Taj Ward break the world record for Line Throw in a time of 8.99 first person in history to go under 9 seconds .

The rest of the day we had competitors racing in the 100/200 Obstacle, 50 Manikin / Brick Carry, 100 Manikin Tow, 100 Manikin Carry, Patient Tow plus the 4 person Manikin, Obstacle and Medley Relay. The Master 200 obstacle relay team of Emily, Jo, Leila and Jess broke their own Australian record for the 2nd year in a row.

By the end of the Sunday we were starting to pack up when we were told to head to pool deck where we were announced as the 2022 Winners with a total score of 649. West Beach won over 100 medals consisting of 38 Gold, 31 Silver, 33 Bronze not including medals won by composite teams. By winning this season it made WB Back to Back winners.

Next up we had a group of 21 competitors attend Nationals in early August.
